13	STATES AND COMMUNITIES NETWORK, WHICH, TO THE EXTENT IT IS	
14	POSSIBLE, WILL BE A PROCESS THAT INCORPORATES UNIVERSAL DESIGN	
15	PRINCIPLES.	
16	WHEREAS, according to the United States Census Bureau's 2020 Census, 23.8% of City	
17	of Santa Fe ("City") residents are ages 65 or older as compared to 16.04% nationwide; and	
18	WHEREAS, according to the United States Census Bureau's article "The Next Four	
19	Decades: The Older Population in the United States: 2010 to 2050," the U.S. population aged 65	
20	and over is expected to grow from 40.2 million in 2010 to 88.5 million by 2050, increasing the total	
21	share of the 65 and over population from 12 percent to 20 percent of the total population; and	
22	WHEREAS, according to the New Mexico Human Services Department's "2021 Data	
23	Book", the elderly population of Santa Fe County is projected to increase from 25.3% in 2019 to	
24	58.2% of adults ages of 65 and over by the year 2030; and	
25	WHEREAS, the World Health Organization ("WHO") has developed the WHO "Global	

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1	Network of Age-Friendly Cities and Communities" to encourage and promote public policies to	
2	increase the number of communities that support active aging and thereby improve the health, well	
3	being, satisfaction, and quality of life for older adults; and	
4	WHEREAS, the American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) "Age-Friendly States	
5	and Communities" is a national program affiliated with the WHO's Global Network of Age-	
6	Friendly Cities and Communities; and	
7	WHEREAS, members of the AARP Network of Age-Friendly States and Communities	
8	benefit from:	
9	A. Automatic entry to the WHO global network.	
10	B. A wide range of free resources on age-friendly and livable communities	
11	C. The latest news and information about best practices, events, results, challenges,	
12	and new initiatives	
13	D. Opportunities for partnerships with other cities, both domestic and international	
14	E. Peer-to-peer learning opportunities	
15	F. Public recognition of the community's commitment to become more age-friendly;	
16	and	
17	WHEREAS, the Governing Body agrees with the AARP's Network of Age-Friendly	
18	States and Communities belief that "people of all ages benefit from the adoption of policies and	
19	programs that make neighborhoods walkable, feature transportation options, enable access to key	
20	services, provide opportunities to participate in community activities, and support housing that's	
21	affordable and adaptable"; and	
22	WHEREAS, the WHO and AARP recognize that towns, cities, and communities have	
23	different needs, resources, and varying capacities to engage their resources to take action to	
24	facilitate active aging; and	
25	WHEREAS, the WHO established eight domains of community life that should be	

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1	formally targeted for livability and quality of life for persons of all ages:	
2	A. Outdoor spaces and building	
3	B. Transportation	
4	C. Housing	
5	D. Social participation	
6	E. Respect and Social inclusion	
7	F. Civic Participation and employment	
8	G. Communication and information; and	
9	H. Community support and health services; and	
10	WHEREAS, the Governing Body would like the City to join the AARP Network Age-	
11	Friendly States and Communities; and	
12	WHEREAS, the Governing Body believes, and research supports, the idea that the	
13	concepts of "universal design", and their focus on accessibility, are a clear complement to the goals	
14	of being an age friendly city; and	
15	WHEREAS, specifically, according to the article "Universal Design: A Step Toward	
16	Successful Aging," published in the Journal of Aging Research in 2012, the concepts of Universal	
17	Design support the Age-Friendly rationale by having "the potential to affect older adult's	
18	engagement with life, by providing accessible and accommodating environments in which this	
19	population can thrive without stigmatization"; and	
20	WHEREAS, according to the Center for Disability Rights, Ron Mace, an architect known	
21	for his role in coining the term "Universal Design" and championing accessible building codes and	
22	standards in the United States, defines universal design as "the design of products and environments	
23	to be usable by all people, to the greatest extent possible, without the need for adaptations or	
24	specialized design"; and	
25	WHEREAS, according to the article "Universal Design: A Step Toward Successful	

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1	Aging," which was published in the Journal of Aging Research in 2012, the seven principles of	
2	Universal Design are as follows:	
3	A. Equitable use	
4	• Useful and marketable to people with diverse abilities	
5	B. Flexibility in Use	
6	• Accommodates a wide range of individual preferences and abilities	
7	C. Simple and Intuitive Use	
8	• Easy to understand, regardless of user's experience, knowledge,	
9	language skills, or current concentration level	
10	D. Perceptible Information	
11	• Communicates necessary information effectively to the user,	
12	regardless of ambient conditions or the user's sensory abilities	
13	E. Tolerance for Error	
14	• Minimizes hazards and the adverse consequences of accidental or	
15	unintended actions	
16	F. Low Physical Effort	
17	• Can be used efficiently and comfortably with a minimum of fatigue	
18	G. Size and Space for Approach and Use	
19	• Appropriate size and space provided for approach, reach,	
20	manipulation, and use regardless of the user's body size, posture, or	
21	mobility; and	
22	WHEREAS, the City has a history of seeking to create an inclusive environment for all	
23	individuals; and	
24	WHEREAS, Section 2.02 of the City's Charter states that "human and civil rights of	
25	residents of Santa Fe and inviolate" and that "the governing body shall preserve, protect and	
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1	promote human rights through all of its activities" and that those rights "shall not be diminished	
2	or otherwise infringed", regardless of age; and	
3	WHEREAS, the City recognizes that compliance with Title II of the Americans with	
4	Disabilities Act, Section 202, addresses some of the accessibility goals of the Age Friendly States	
5	and Communities network; and	
6	WHEREAS, consulting committees with specialized knowledge on accessibility matters,	
7	such as the Mayor's Committee on Disability, can be beneficial when working toward creating an	
8	inclusive community.	
9	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE	
10	CITY OF SANTA FE that it is committed to making Santa Fe a well-designed, livable community	
11	that promotes health and sustained accessibility for community members of all ages.	
12	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager or the City Manager's designee	
13	will enroll the City in the AARP Network of Age-Friendly States and Communities by submitting	
14	the required membership application and committing the City to a 5-year process of improvement	
15	according to the following timeline:	
16	1. First 30 days: Enroll into the network of AARP Network of Age-Friendly States	
17	and Communities;	
18	2. Year 1: Conduct a community needs assessment and present results to the	
19	Governing Body, including identifying what work the City already has in place	
20	that contributes to qualifying as an Age-Friendly city, as defined by the AARP	
21	Network of Age Friendly States and Communities program;	
22	3. Year 2: Develop and present an action plan to the Governing Body for approval;	
23	4. Years 3-5: Implement the action plan and track progress; and	
24	5. Year 5: Evaluate the impact of the work and present a progress report to the	
25	Governing Body.	
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1	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, to the extent it is possible and practical, the City	
2	will incorporate Universal Design principles in its planning process for the 5-year commitment	
3	described above, and in doing so, will collaborate with committees that have relevant, specialize	
4	expertise, such as the Mayor's Committee on Disability.

**WHEREAS,** the City recognizes that compliance with Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act, Section 202, addresses some of the accessibility goals of the Age Friendly States and Communities network; and
