11	CALLING ON THE NEW MEXICO CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION TO ADVOCATE
12	FOR THE PRESERVATION AND MANAGEMENT OF NEW MEXICO'S PUBLIC
13	LANDS.
14	WHEREAS, New Mexico is home to public lands, comprising a significant proportion
15	approximately 31.7% of its total area; and
16	WHEREAS, public lands are integral to New Mexico's economy, environment, and
17	quality of life; and
18	WHEREAS, federal agencies manage a large proportion of New Mexico's public lands
19	("Public Lands"), such as the United States Forest Service, National Park Service, and the Bureau
20	of Land Management, and provide essential resources, including grazing lands for agricultural
21	operations, habitats for wildlife, and opportunities for outdoor recreation; and
22	WHEREAS, the residents of Santa Fe deeply value Public Lands for their recreational,
23	economic, cultural, and spiritual significance, recognizing that these lands are accessible to all,
24	regardless of socioeconomic status, race, or gender; and
25	WHEREAS, Public Lands contribute significantly to the local economy through activities

such as mineral extraction, timber sales, ranching, tourism, and outdoor recreation, which contribute substantially to New Mexico's economy; and

WHEREAS, the 2023 United States Bureau of Economic Analysis shows that outdoor recreation in New Mexico generated \$3.2 billion in economic output, accounted for 2.4% of the state's Gross Domestic Product, and supported 29,182 jobs, demonstrating the profound economic significance of Public Lands and outdoor recreation to New Mexico and to the city of Santa Fe; and

WHEREAS, there are ongoing attempts to transfer or sell off Public Lands and such attempts are inconsistent with the values and interests of the residents of Santa Fe and New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, federal management of Public Lands ensures that resources are managed for the benefit of all Americans, creating the opportunity to address complex challenges such as wildfire management, watershed protection, and wildlife conservation; and

WHEREAS, the cost associated with managing Public Lands is a national responsibility, and federal involvement is crucial for the long-term health and sustainability of the resources on Public Land; and

**WHEREAS,** the City of Santa Fe ("City") recognizes the importance of multiple uses of Public Lands, including but not limited to, grazing, energy development, and recreation; and

**WHEREAS,** the City also recognizes the importance of Public Lands to the community and the City's role in supporting preservation of public lands.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE

- Strongly supports the continued federal management and stewardship of Public Lands within New Mexico.
- 2. Opposes any efforts to sell, transfer, or dispose of Public Lands.

1	3. Encourages New Mexico's Congressional Delegation to oppose any legislation that
2	would negatively impact Public Lands and to support policies that ensure their long-
3	term preservation and sustainable use.
4	4. Asks New Mexico's Congressional Delegation to fully fund the operation,
5	maintenance, and preservation of New Mexico's public lands and oppose any attempts
6	to change the Antiquities Act or reduce the size of New Mexico's national monuments.
7	5. Recognizes the multiple uses of public lands and encourages a balanced approach to
8	land management.
9	6. Urges federal land management agencies to continue their collaborative efforts with
10	local communities, stakeholders, and other governmental entities to ensure effective
11	and responsible management of public lands.
12	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk provide copies of this resolution to
13	the members of New Mexico's Congressional Delegation, Governor of New Mexico, United States
14	Department of the Interior, United States Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, United
15	States Fish and Wildlife Service, and National Park Service.
