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10	A RESOLUTION		
11	AMENDING THE IMMIGRATION COMMITTEE'S PURPOSE AND MEMBERSHIP.		
12	WHEREAS, on January 13, 1999, the Governing Body adopted Resolution No. 1999-6		
13	declaring a policy of non-discrimination on the basis of a person's national origin and appointing		
14	an immigration taskforce; and		
15	WHEREAS, on January 16, 2002, the Governing Body adopted Resolution No. 2002-3,		
16	which renamed the Immigration Taskforce the "Immigration Committee"; and		
17	WHEREAS, on October 9, 2002, the Governing Body adopted Resolution No. 2002-58,		
18	which decreased the number of members on the Immigration Committee from fifteen to nine		
19	members; and		
20	WHEREAS, on October 8, 2014, the Governing Body adopted Resolution No. 2014-82,		
21	declaring its "continuous" support for immigrant issues in Santa Fe, the state of New Mexico, and		
22	throughout the United States; and		
23	WHEREAS, the Governing Body continues to support the policy of non-discrimination		
24	established by Resolution No. 1999-6; and		
25	WHEREAS, the City's Charter, Article II, Section 2.02, "Human and Civil Rights", states		
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1	that the City holds human and civil rights as inviolate and states that these rights "shall not be				
2	diminished or otherwise infringed" regardless of "ethnicity, race, age, religion, creed, color,				
3	national origin, ancestry, sex, gender, sexual orientation, physical or mental disability, medical				
4	condition or citizenship status"; and				
5	WHEREAS, the purposes and membership of the Immigration Committee have not				
6	changed since the Governing Body's resolution in 2002; and				
7	WHEREAS, the Governing Body wishes to amend the Committee's purposes and				
8	membership as is shown below:				
9	Section 1. NAME: The committee shall be called the Immigration Committee.				
10	Section 2. PURPOSE: [The committee shall monitor the human rights status of				
11	non-citizens residing in the city of Santa Fe and report its findings and recommendations to the				
12	governing body] The purpose of the Immigration Committee is to advise the City about policies				
13	and actions that would preserve and promote humane treatment and equal protection for immigrants				
14	and immigrant populations in Santa Fe consistent with the City's Charter, Section 2.02 "Human				
15	and civil rights".				
16	Section 3. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: The committee shall [meet as				
17	necessary to accomplish its purpose and shall follow adopted city policy and procedures] perform				
18	the following duties and responsibilities:				
19	(a) Monitor the human rights status of immigrant populations residing in the city of Santa				
20	<u>Fe.</u>				
21	(b) Advise the City regarding policies, programs, and legislation as they relate to				
22	immigrants and immigrant populations in Santa Fe.				
23	(c) Collaborate with other agencies and/or groups, such as, but not limited to,				
24	county/state/federal agencies, labor organizations, religious groups, healthcare and				
25	educational institutions, and non-profits,, to respond to share resources and				
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1	information with one another and with the community, and participate in any			
2	other collaborative activities, as are consistent with the purpose of the			
3	committee, as needed, to support the purposes of the committee.			
4	Section 4. MEMBERSHIP AND OFFICERS: The committee [membership]			
5	shall consist of a City councilor, who shall also serve as its chair, along with nine			
6	representatives residing in the county of Santa Fe and selected from the following areas:			
7	human rights, social services, business community, health care, labor organizations,			
8	religious community, youth services providers, women's advocacy groups, educators, and			
9	legal services. More than one member may represent one of the areas and one member may			
10	represent multiple areas. Not all areas need to be represented. The members shall be			
11	appointed by the mayor with the [approval] consent of the governing body. The			
12	[chairperson shall be appointed by the mayor and the] committee shall designate the vice-			
13	chairperson [shall be designated by the committee].			
14	Section 5. TERMS: The members shall serve for a period of two years. The			
15	committee members shall serve at the pleasure of the mayor and may be removed at any time, with			
16	or without cause.			
17	Section 6. STAFF LIAISON: The city manager shall designate [the intercultural			
18	affairs planner] a staff member from the Office of Equity and Inclusion or other city staff member			
19	as liaison to the committee.			
20	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE			
21	CITY OF SANTA FE that the amended rules and procedures shall read as follows:			
22	Section 1. The Committee shall be called the Immigration Committee.			
23	Section 2. PURPOSE: The purpose of the Immigration Committee is to advise the			
24	City about policies and actions that would preserve and promote humane treatment and equal			
25	protection for immigrants and immigrant populations in Santa Fe consistent with the City's Charter,			
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1	Section 2.02, "Human and civil rights".		
2	Section 3. DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES: The committee shall preform the		
3	following duties and responsibilities:		
4	(a) Monitor the human rights status of immigrant populations residing in the city of Santa		
5	Fe.		
6	(b) Advise the City regarding policies, programs, and legislation as they relate to		
7	immigrants and immigrant populations in Santa Fe.		
8	(c) Collaborate with other agencies and/or groups, such as, but not limited to,		
9	county/state/federal agencies, labor organizations, religious groups, healthcare and		
10	educational institutions, and non-profits, to share resources and information with one		
11	another and with the community, and participate in any other collaborative activities,		
12	as are consistent with the purpose of the committee, as needed, to support the purposes		
13	of the committee.		
14	Section 4. MEMBERSHIP AND OFFICERS: The committee shall consist of a City		
15	Councilor, who shall also serve as its chair, along with nine representatives residing in the county		
16	of Santa Fe and selected from the following areas: human rights, social services, business		
17	community, health care, labor organizations, religious community, youth services providers,		
18	women's advocacy groups, educators, and legal services. More than one member may represent		
19	one of the areas and one member may represent multiple areas. Not all areas need to be represented.		
20	The members shall be appointed by the mayor with the consent of the governing body. The		
21	committee shall designate the vice-chairperson.		
22	Section 5. TERMS: The members shall serve for a period of two years. The		
23	committee members shall serve at the pleasure of the mayor and may be removed at any time, with		
24	or without cause.		
25	Section 6. STAFF LIAISON: The city manager shall designate a staff member from		
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1	the Office of Equity and Inclusion or other city staff member as staff liaison to the committee.			
2	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the committee shall continue to follow the City's			
3	procedural rules for Committees in carrying out its duties.
