**CALL TO ORDER**

A regular meeting of the Santa Fé MPO Technical Coordinating Committee was called to order on the above date by Mark Tibbetts, at approximately 1:30 p.m. in the Large Conference Room, 500 Market Station, Suite 200, Santa Fé, New Mexico.

**Mr. Mortillaro moved to approve the agenda as published. Mr. Quintana seconded the motion**

and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

## **APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES FROM September 22, 2014**

**September 22, 2014**

Mr. Quintana moved to approve the minutes of September 22, 2014 as presented. Mr. Martínez seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

**October 27, 2014**

Ms. Baer moved to approve the minutes of October 27, 2014 as presented. Mr. Aaboe seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

### **1. COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE PUBLIC**

There were no communications from the public.

### **2. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION**

#### **a. Review and Recommendation on Amendment 6 of the FFY2014-2017 Transportation Improvement Program – MPO Staff**

Mr. Tibbetts said this was the main action for this meeting. He asked the members to review the spreadsheet which, on the back, gave the details of the actual amendments.

Mr. Quintana said the first state projects were the overlaying of bridge decks and should not take much time to complete. The one on I-25 at mile post 282 (#12) was a bridge hit recently by equipment towed on a truck. It is now a replacement for \$1million. Project #13 would probably have construction in 2016.

Mr. Tibbetts said #29, the Acequia Trail underpass, would now use flex funds that once related to #28 and reallocate them from the Santa Fé River crossing at West Alameda and St. Francis.

#30 is the project with Federal Land money the County recently received. It shows the federal portion and is scheduled for 2015 and 2016.

Ms. Baer asked the status of the reallocation of those flex funds.

Mr. Martínez said the Governing Body approval was on September 23, 2014.

Mr. Tibbetts said he was looking for a recommendation so the TPB could approve it on Thursday.

**Ms. Baer moved to recommend approval of the amendment to the TPB. Mr. Smithson seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.**

**b. Recommend approval of the Meetings Schedule for 2015**

Mr. Tibbetts shared the proposed calendar of meeting dates to be approved by the TPB on November 20, 2014.

Mr. Aaboe said no county representatives could attend the May 25<sup>th</sup> meeting because of the Board of County Commissioners' meeting to be held on that date in the afternoon.

Mr. Tibbetts asked if that meeting could be changed to May 18<sup>th</sup>. The Committee agreed.

**Mr. Smithson moved to recommend approval of the 2015 meeting schedule to the TPB as amended in May for the TCC to meet on Monday, May 18. Mr. Quintana seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.**

Mr. Tibbetts asked about whether the TCC should have a December meeting.

After a brief discussion, the Committee decided a December meeting was not needed.

Mr. Tibbetts agreed to send a notice out.

**c. Metropolitan Transportation Plan 2015-2040: Public Comments – MPO Staff**

Mr. Aune announced a contract was awarded to a company in the Denver area to assist the staff in updating the MTP.

Mr. Tibbetts said the firm was located in Centennial, Colorado and has done extensive long range planning in Colorado. They have a good repertoire with 125 staff. They were reasonable in their bid and sounded excited about working with the MPO on this plan.

**d. Public Transit Plan Status Report – MPO Staff**

Mr. Aune said they were moving forward well on the Public Transit Plan. The next step was for KFH to make recommendations on modifying routes for service providers to be reviewed in November and December and, based on that, to make supporting presentations to TPB and TCC in January. There will be two public meetings. The first is December 8 from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. particularly looking at how the plan relates to the south side.

The second meeting is on December 11 at 10:30 a.m. at Market Station where the tourist industry will

look at Santa Fé Pickup routes. Administration of Santa Fé Pickup recently was moved from Parking to Santa Fé Trails.

Mr. Mortillaro pointed out that the NCRTD funds most of the Santa Fé Pickup costs. Any changes will need to be discussed with NCRTD Board and could mean programmatic amendments. He explained that if it is a fixed route service, it would be a problem. The RTD rates are free and their routes are fare-based.

Mr. Tibbetts thanked him for that information.

Mr. Smithson agreed. He added that there is now a new interest for SFCC weekend service.

**e. Pedestrian Plan Status Report – MPO Staff**

Mr. Tibbetts reported that Design Office is finalizing the documents. The most recent presentation was to COLTPAC and another one will be given at the BTAC meeting this Wednesday. They are still on track to have a draft by year end and will get that out and have a public review very soon.

**f. Highway Safety Improvement Program– MPO Staff**

Mr. Tibbetts referred to the handout. The safety audit was recently approved for St. Mike's and Guadalupe Street from Agua Fria to Paseo de Peralta. Both were in the final stages. The Guadalupe draft is being prepared for final presentation.

He added that the Feral Rail Authority was here recently looking at crossing safety with the New Mexico Rail Runner. The road safety audit was just approved for St. Francis and Cerrillos Road.

**g. Transportation Improvement Program: Project Updates – MPO Staff**

Mr. Tibbetts provided a 2-page handout and said he wouldn't go through all of them as most of it was very familiar to everyone already.

Mr. Quintana summarized the state projects quickly.

Mr. Smithson said the South Side Transit Center was at phase 2 and would consider proposals from the RFP this week. It called for an aggressive schedule to be completed by December 2015.

Mr. Mortillaro asked if the Center would also accommodate NCRTD buses.

Mr. Smithson agreed and also accommodate Park and Ride buses. It would have 8 bays so there would be plenty of room.

Mr. Smithson said for TS 50 that the buses have been delivered and they were getting equipment installed now. They already submitted the reimbursement request.

On page 3 for TS 80, they were in the design phase for the bus shelter projects and the scheduled deadline for replacements was by September 2015. The old ones would either be auctioned or salvage.

Mr. Tibbetts said he got a letter saying they were scrapped because they were unsafe.

Mr. Smithson said that was not true. Santa Fé Trails is re-branding all of the stops. The old shelters could be used at a parking lot but not on a route.

Ms. Baer asked if there were city bus stop at Agua Fria Village.

Mr. Smithson said there were several stops on Agua Fria there.

Mr. Martínez commented on the Cerrillos Road project that DOT ROW and acquisition processes were delaying city construction until 2016.

Mr. Aaboe noted on 120 that they looked at a couple of routes through the matrix again and altered the prioritization of routes. A point was raised by DOT Environmental about crossing a segment of El Camino Real so the County is going to work with NPS folks on that.

For the project shown at the bottom of page 3, the County got coop agreements and that was scheduled for approval at the BCC meeting on November 25.

He said project 11-410 was not on this matrix but they got draft agreements from DOT and will bring it to the City for approval.

Mr. Aune said once that is agreed, it will go on this list.

### **3. MATTERS FROM THE MPO STAFF**

Mr. Tibbetts reported that MPO Staff met with NPS and were planning to add these major national trails to the MPO map to show how they cross the MPO area. There are three of them: 1 is Old Santa Fé Trail; 2 is El Camino Real, and 3 is Old Spanish Trail. We will share notifications with NPS on these alignments and take any opportunity to improve it into a viable trail system.

He noted coincidentally that the trail mirrors along the N/S connector, Rabbit Road and the Gail Ryba Trail. So there are opportunities for federal signage and in some areas, an opportunity for major economic development funds with that identification. It is an opportunity that the MPO feels is significant. We won't devote a lot of pages in the MTP but will call attention to them. We can show the overlay when we work on the document. They were very happy just to have us say that. Also, Rufina Street parallels it all the way long. So we were asking for amenities that recognized it. They recognize streets and urban trails.

Mr. Tibbetts said they have a meeting with the City tomorrow for updating the MTP, future road networks, etc. He wanted to set a meeting with the County also in the next two weeks.

#### **4. MATTERS FROM TCC MEMBERS**

Ms. Baer shared a need of a woman who had a lot of trouble scheduling rides and also reporting to the TCC those problems. She said she had to schedule her ride 24 hours in advance and was told it could have a half hour lee way either earlier or later. She also had to schedule a return trip but it wasn't available until several hours later. Ms. Baer asked to whom she should address those and get some help with it.

Mr. Smithson offered to help with it. He noted that the Santa Fé Ride program is governed by ADA and can impact service at times. But she should be able to call as late as 7 p.m. for a trip the following day as early as 8 a.m. Santa Fe Ride can't guarantee the time but offers 15 minutes either way and ask them to determine when the return trip might be.

Mr. Quintana announced the DOT got some HSIP funds recently and some is for ROW signs and that will require another amendment. He would provide more information and they might need approval in January.

Mr. Tibbetts understood and would notify members if the December meeting was needed for that approval. If they did not need to meet, he wished everyone happy holidays.

#### **5. ADJOURN – Next Meeting on December 8, 2014**

The meeting was adjourned at 2:30 p.m.

## **Update on the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)**

One HSIP Application was submitted by NMDOT District 5 for review by the HSIP Safety Selection Committee on November 7<sup>th</sup>. The application was a request for funding for a Road Safety Audit (RSA) to look at the St Francis Dr/Cerrillos Rd Intersection which was identified as the 4<sup>th</sup> Most Hazardous Intersection in the MPO Planning Area. The application was approved and \$45,000 was allocated to conduct the RSA. No schedule has been set yet to start the RSA.

The HSIP program is now transitioning to the NMDOT Planning and Safety Division and with it a review of the process and schedule for Selection Committee meetings will occur.

Update on past approved HSIP Applications:

### **St Michaels Dr/Rail Trail Crossing Road Safety Audit (RSA)**

This RSA reviewed crossing alternatives for the Rail Trail Crossing of St Michaels Drive. Both at grade and grade separated alternatives were evaluated. The final RSA Report was completed on October 28<sup>th</sup> with recommendation to conduct a more detailed evaluation of a Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon or Pedestrian Signal (at grade) for the Crossing. This detailed evaluation will determine if this at-grade option can be installed without interfering with the Rail Safety Equipment. If the at grade options cannot be accommodated then a more detailed evaluation of a tunnel will be pursued.

### **Guadalupe Street Road Safety Audit (RSA)**

This RSA is looking at the segment of Guadalupe Street from Agua Fria Street to Paseo De Peralta (north). Guadalupe Street is a four lane facility with little to no median throughout the majority of the section. With no median refuge, pedestrian crossing is very difficult, especially at uncontrolled locations. The lack of median also leads to weaving of vehicles around vehicles wanting to make left turns. With no shoulder along this stretch, there is no buffer between the sidewalk and the adjacent travelled way.

Data collection was completed in early September and a RSA Team walk through was conducted in early October.

A draft of the RSA is expected next week.

### **Design and Construction of a Roundabout at the Intersection of Agua Fria Street and Cottonwood Drive**

This intersection was identified in the MPO analysis of crash data, as the most hazardous intersection in the MPO area. Based on a review of the crash types and additional analysis by the City of Santa Fe a Roundabout has been identified as the best counter measure to resolve the crash problem. This project was awarded \$1.2 million in HSIP Funds for design and construction. The funding was added to the TIP and STIP with the last amendment. The city is in the process of finalizing the Cooperative Agreement with NMDOT for the Design Funding before going out with an RFP for design services. It is expected that design will begin near the end of the year and construction is scheduled for late 2016 or early 2017.

### **2. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION**

#### **a. Presentation on the Pedestrian Master Plan – Claudia Horn, Design Office**

Ms. Horn, with Design Office, gave the presentation on the Pedestrian Master Plan which she said was somewhat of a re-hash of the presentation made last year. The plan looked at the entire MPO area but mostly Santa Fe City proper due to higher density. This would feed into the MTP along with the Transit Master Plan with a draft in a month and the entire plan is to be completed by year end.

Ms. Horn went through the plan presentation. A copy of the plan is available on the MPO web site. She compared Santa Fe with other communities regarding economic impact of a good pedestrian master plan. Phase 1 narrowed down the areas to be part of data collection. She shared the inventory of sidewalks in the areas. It included the 21 miles of urban trails and 47 miles of minor trails and prescription trail locations. They also analyzed crash data and identified high risk areas for pedestrians.

They collected over a thousand comments from the public meetings and surveys. Many comments were about intersections and another group concerned trajectories. 54% of comments were about connectivity; 47% on safety. It showed where people were having issues with sidewalks and safety. In summarizing, she said Santa Fe needs to focus on inadequate infrastructure, accessibility, and public awareness.

Phase II embarked on an effort to identify issues using available objective data. It located where people would walk and identified deficiencies in the system at those places. They divided the indicators into three categories for considering importance. She described a "network" that made it comfortable for walking. There are other factors that affect destinations. For some of them, they did not have sufficient data. Collecting that data is of high importance.

Mr. Quintana asked about the Airport Road area which recently had received improvements and was kind of lost about why that was a high need area.

Ms. Horn said it was something that they needed to review in their projects and see what the project was trying to address in those improvements. The reason it is ranked high is because of the huge number of lanes pedestrians are trying to cross. There are lots of commercial with residential in close proximity, transit routes, as well as many accidents that have occurred there.

Ms. Leider said the accidents are what triggered it.

Ms. Horn said having more information available would allow them to have a more accurate map.

Mr. Tibbetts said it was not misrepresentation but lack of data. These areas require a more comprehensive study. That intersection around Zafarano was brought up many times in public meetings.

Ms. Leider said another thing that triggered it was that the sidewalks do not connect with buildings there.

Mr. Quintana thought it was strange that Cerrillos Road beyond the Indian School does not show as high.

Ms. Horn said that area is in the entire project list.

Ms. Maes asked if they were going to include areas near Tesuque.

Ms. Horn said they did have information for Tesuque but there are not as many.

Ms. Leider said there was one area in Eldorado and two in Tesuque. The numbers there are very different with different conditions.

Ms. Maes asked if they would also be looking at Tesuque Village. Ms. Horn agreed.

Mr. Kelly asked if the crash data included the time of day factors.

Ms. Horn asked if that was collected.

Mr. Wilson said it is available.

Mr. Martinez asked about recommendations.

Ms. Horn said they would get to the recommendations and clarified this was just data analysis. The rest was forthcoming in a report.

After further questions, Ms. Horn surmised they needed to look at the pedestrian crashes with a finer toothed comb to see what the other conditions were.

Mr. Wilson noted that crash data is not the only filter.

Ms. Horn agreed. There were other factors considered like sidewalks and the data is still being analyzed.

Mr. Quintana asked if a ~~project~~ project was already programmed to address an issue, if it should be in your plan

Ms. Horn thought it would be useful for the Committee members to have all of the comments. She knew there were projects in planning stages.

Ms. Leider clarified that this is not prioritization, just a rating.

Mr. Tibbetts said it was important to see this as a component of the MTP and the idea is to show consistency and improvements.

The Committee commented further on the presentation.

Mr. Wilson pointed out that this is still in draft form.

Mr. Tibbetts said more tweaking can be done.

Ms. Maes had concerns because it does not appear the consultants are incorporating the outlying areas in this project. She asked how they would rate those to compete with these projects since we don't have data and density.

Ms. Horn said it was a good question and thought there should be a weighting factor so rural areas can compete. This method does not do that.

Ms. Maes understood that but when you look at these plans you have to be able to factor it in.

Ms. Horn said there were 262 projects included here and agreed to send her the ones that were in the outlying areas as rural projects

Mr. Martínez asked if they were looking to lump things together like the bike master plan.

Ms. Horn said they have not gotten there yet.

Mr. Martínez said that would be useful to us.

Mr. Kelly asked if their tool was comparable to towns like Boulder and how they approach the problems.

Ms. Horn agreed and said they looked at a number of different municipalities.

Mr. Romero thought it would be better to separate the public comments into the types of projects.

Ms. Horn said that was a good comment.

Ms. Leider noted that in comments from Tierra Contenta, that they cannot use their sidewalks due to over growth. She asked how ~~that~~ factors into the City's plans.

Mr. Romero said that is a maintenance issue and the question is whether the City has enough resources to maintain it and whether the property owners are maintaining what they need to maintain. Enforcement could be one of the recommendations. He agreed to talk with Mr. Pino about it.

Ms. Maes asked if they were going to separate the crash from a bus crossing and how they would identify that.

Ms. Horn said it goes back to sifting through the vehicle pedestrian crash data and that will take a lot of time. Some of it depends on the report they write.

Mr. Romero said the City has crash database with a pedestrian column. He agreed to get that to her. Ms. Horn thanked him.

Ms. Maes excused herself from the meeting and the discussion continued.

At the end of her presentation, Ms. Horn thanked the TCC for their feedback. She said she could email the project list.

Mr. Martínez asked when they expected to have a draft for review.

Ms. Horn said it would be another month or month and a half.

#### **b. Transportation Alternatives Program: Call for Projects – MPO Staff**

Mr. Wilson presented a slide presentation regarding the TAP Call for Projects for FY 16/17 and reviewed it briefly with the Committee. It is a cost reimbursement program requiring a 5% local match. Applications have to be submitted through the MPO. It is now a statewide process so applications compete with others in the state. Categories are established by community size. DOT put a maximum request of \$2 million of TAP funds. He provided a list of those in 2,000 to 5,000 population that were eligible for rural funding. Maintenance projects were not eligible and non-profits were not either. Local government agreements were required. The MPO was asked to implement a project feasibility project to screen applications. The deadline would be January 16, 2015 with submission to DOT by February 1, 2015. A scoring system would be used by a selection committee appointed by DOT. The DOT would have discretion to ensure all parts of the state received some funding.

Mr. Wilson proposed having a workshop to go over more details of this program.

**c. Recreational Trails Program: Call for Projects – MPO Staff**

Mr. Wilson said this offering was similar but different from TAP. DOT was in the process of developing guidelines. 30% of funds have to go to motorized recreational trails, 30% to non-motorized recreational trails and 40% for either way. Typically there was about \$1.5 million each year for recreational trails. This year there may be \$5 million available for 2016 for recreational trails. He proposed having a workshop on it once he received guidance on the requirements.

**d. Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Project Updates – MPO Staff**

Mr. Wilson provided a handout with the updates, and said nothing substantial had changed. He agreed to get more specifics and asked TCC members to email any updates to him.

**e. Metropolitan Transportation Plan 2015-2040 Update – MPO Staff**

Mr. Wilson said they put out an RFQ last week to get proposals to assist in writing this MTP plan. October 7<sup>th</sup> is the deadline to receive responses. The Staff is maxed out and needs some help pulling it together.

**f. Update on the Highway Safety Improvement Program – MPO Staff**

Mr. Wilson said that in the past the state went through the district and the MPO applied for the Rail Trail at St. Mikes. He had a revised draft of that and the next RSA meeting would be on October 2<sup>nd</sup>. He would give an overview at the next meeting on the results of the Road Safety Audit. Mr. Romero applied for an RSA for Guadalupe from Agua Fria to Paseo de Peralta. That RSA is underway with a site visit and brainstorming on October 8. The construction funding is approved for Cottonwood and Agua Fria and awaiting approval at FHWA.

Plans are being discussed for an RSA at Cerrillos and St. Francis. They had a working group meeting last week with possible funding for enforcement and education. There are other locations being considered including the 599 off ramp for shortness and the off ramp at Guadalupe.

The Committee discussed other possibilities for applications for use of this funding source.

There were no other matters from the MPO Staff.



**APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

**Mr. Smithson moved to approve the agenda as amended with the minutes postponed to the next meeting. Ms. Baer seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.**

## **APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES FROM September 22, 2014**

The minutes were not available and were postponed to the next meeting.

### **1. COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE PUBLIC**

There were no communications from the public.

Mr. Wilson introduced Mr. Jason Coffey, Urban and Regional Planner NMDOT, who replaces Rosa at these meetings and Mr. Thomas Martínez, new maintenance manager for Santa Fé Trails.

### **2. ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION**

#### **a. Review and Release for Public Review of a Proposed Amendment to the FFY 2014-2017 Transportation Improvement Program**

Mr. Wilson went through the table in the packet [attached to the minutes as Exhibit 1] and pointed out the amendments. The first was to add Project S100400, page 12, as ADA improvements at Cerrillos Road and Second Street intersection as well as a City bus turnout to improve traffic pattern there.

Mr. Martínez said they were looking for some City financial participation.

Mr. Wilson said currently it appeared to be a full state funded or full city funded project with a budget of \$150,000. Once it was supported, he would flesh out the details and because it was not now, it would not be added to the amendment at this time.

The next one was S100390 on page 29, Acequia Trail Underpass Construction as a new project to be added following award of CMAQ Flex Funding at \$3,820,000.

Mr. Wilson said the El Camino Real/Buckman Road Retracement Project on page 30 has funds awarded but no financial details provided yet. If the details are received in time he would insert that into the amendment.

Mr. Wilson said the City has decided not to fund any more on the Santa Fe River Trail Crossing at St. Francis and Alameda so it is deemed no longer regionally significant. They have to do a formal amendment to remove it.

Mr. Wilson said the amendment would have a public review then come back to this body to recommend

to the Transportation Policy Board in November. The TCC meeting is on November 17<sup>th</sup>.

Mr. Aaboe pointed out a typo in Project S100283 on page 28 - pedestrian, not pedestrain.

Mr. Wilson thanked him and would correct it.

**Ms. Baer moved to approve the release of the amendment for public review. Mr. Martínez seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.**

**b. Transportation Alternatives Program: Call for Projects – MPO Staff**

Mr. Wilson presented the Call for Projects for the TAP program with the basics. They made the website resource central for this and requiring a project feasibility form with applications. They are to be submitted when ready. They will work with Rosa Kozub who is the TAP coordinator. The maximum for a project is \$2 million.

Mr. Aaboe asked if the intention was for the form to be submitted before the Governing Body knows about it.

Mr. Wilson agreed.

Mr. Aaboe asked if this would work at the staff level.

Mr. Wilson agreed but they would need a resolution from your governing body before the deadline.

Mr. Aaboe asked if that was November 21<sup>st</sup>.

Mr. Wilson agreed.

Mr. Martínez asked if it was for both design and construction.

Mr. Wilson agreed.

Mr. Martínez asked what to do if they had a design in process but needed assistance to complete the project.

Mr. Wilson clarified on the form is where we ask that.

Mr. Coffey agreed.

Mr. Wilson said to feel free to contact him at any time regarding applications.

**c. Recreational Trails Program: Call for Projects – MPO Staff**

Mr. Wilson said Mr. Coffey volunteered to do a presentation for this program.

This Recreational Trails Program is for maintenance activities.

Mr. Coffey said it included educational programs.

Mr. Wilson said a local match is required and October 31<sup>st</sup> is the deadline.

Mr. Coffey said they could email their applications directly to him.

Mr. Coffey gave the presentation [attached to these minutes as Exhibit 2].

Mr. Aaboe if a project design on the shelf could be allowed for construction.

Mr. Wilson said it would need approval.

Mr. Aune asked if between the applications going to DOT and the advisory board meeting will DOT look at the funding.

Mr. Coffey said Erin would have to answer that.

Mr. Aaboe thought there seemed to be an overlap between this and TAP. He asked if they could apply to both programs.

Mr. Coffey said it was a separate application process but they could apply to both.

Mr. Wilson agreed to put this presentation on the website.

Mr. Martinez asked if these had the same requirements.

Mr. Coffey agreed and suggested they look at that in the PFF.

Mr. Aaboe asked if the full application was due by October 31<sup>st</sup>.

Mr. Coffey said a letter outlining their request was due by October 31<sup>st</sup> and should be sent directly to NMDOT.

The Committee briefly discussed the limitations in scope for the projects.

Mr. Wilson suggested calling him or Erin for answers to questions.

Mr. Wilson was excited about this program. It was the first time he had seen the call for projects for the Recreational Trails Program.

**d. Metropolitan Transportation Plan 2015-2040 Update – MPO Staff**

Mr. Aune recalled at the last meeting we talked about staff walking through the MTP as it is today. That was done and he crafted a scope of work and sent it out in early September. Two good proposals were received and they are pursuing a contract with one of them to get a team on board to help staff coordinate the work. They were planning to issue a newsletter of what the MPO has been doing. One of the tasks is for a general survey on line from which they got about 300 responses. At this juncture staff is looking at consolidation of survey results. The MTP will be moving out in early spring and he invited input.

Mr. Aaboe asked if it would be useful to have our governing bodies say something and asked if the staff still wanted more input. He wondered if the County should provide a press release.

Mr. Wilson said they have done that already for the draft and then would get more formal public input.

Mr. Aaboe suggested providing something through the County Manager's monthly newsletter if that makes sense.

Mr. Wilson agreed. He added that in the next month staff will be meeting with each of our member agencies.

**e. Public Transit Plan Status Report**

Mr. Wilson said staff was trying to keep the website as current as possible.

Mr. Aune said they had 3 technical memoranda and just had a presentation last week to service providers. They were about 2/3 through the process and happy with the work products. They would be finished by the end of this year. They would be presenting to Santa Fé Trails tomorrow. They would get public input in terms of surveys forthcoming. They looked forward to having a draft by January.

**f. Pedestrian Plan Status Report**

Mr. Tibbetts said they were not yet creating a document but were in Phase 2 now. They just uploaded more information on it to the website. Meetings were coming up including the Transportation Policy Board on this Thursday. It was the same as the presentation given to this group in August. They would give a status report of what they have gone through and the results of the rating system and ranking of projects. They have identified 300 projects so far. They created 10 zones that are high priority areas close to schools, bus stops, or high density traffic and talked about developing criteria for multi-modal level service.

Mr. Tibbetts said after this week they would present to POSAC, COLTPAC and other organizations and have a draft by the end of November.

Ms. Baer asked if the draft was going to include the projects

Mr. Tibbetts didn't see staff ranking projects, ranking zones etc. The City does not have budget to do a lot of things. The Plan would highlight them under funding of public works projects.

Ms. Baer said she had missed the presentation and asked if the ranking system was approved.

Mr. Tibbetts agreed that was done. Once they have a draft, it could be considered for approval.

**g. Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Project Updates – MPO Staff**

Mr. Wilson referred to the table in the packet [attached as Exhibit 3]. He asked members to review it individually and let him know of any updates for the Transportation Policy Board.

Mr. Aaboe said S100120 was still in AB.

Mr. Wilson said he would update that.

Mr. Wilson unsure about the date on S1000070.

Ms. Baer said late spring was anticipated.

Mr. Smithson said Santa Fé Trails had a joint project at Valdez Business Park with the Police Department.

Ms. Baer asked if Santa Fé Trails was using the same designs on bus shelters.

Mr. Smithson agreed.

Ms. Baer asked if the City had to purchase property for the joint project.

Mr. Smithson said it was on city-owned land. They had the conceptual plan and are hiring a design firm

Mr. Wilson asked if the funds were sufficient.

Mr. Smithson believed so and were now getting approval from the business park. They are going to use it for signage as approved by Mr. O'Reilly.

Mr. Wilson asked if they would have public input. Mr. Smithson agreed.

Mr. Wilson noted that the Santa Fé Rail Trail was under construction.

Mr. Wilson asked about the Safe Routes to Schools project.

**Mr. Aaboe moved to adjourn the meeting. Ms. Lucero seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.**


