TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 16, 2010

CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the City of Santa Fe Parks and Open Space Advisory Commission was called to order by Chair Bette Booth, on this date at approximately 3:00 pm at Parks Offices, Bldg. C., 1142 Siler Road, Santa Fe, New Mexico.

OLD BUSINESS (Revised Agenda Order)

- Parks Division Update

Mr. Chávez gave an update of the Parks. A summary follows:

- *Ragle Park* -on schedule; completion expected to be mid December.
- *BMX Park*- 40% complete.
- *River Parkway* -first 2 portions, from Camino Alire to Gonzalez Elementary-finished except for work needed in the spring. Tree planting was complete.

Ms. Veneklasen entered the meeting at this time.

- GCCC – design documents were finished and preliminary excavation started.
- *Ashbaugh*-bid documents finished this week.
- *Salvador Perez*- ready to bid.

- *Park at del Rio*-construction documents almost ready; possibly would go to bid after January. Brian Drypolcher would meet with Chair Booth and people from the skate park. The decision was made to tear out what was there and build what could be done with available money.
- *Las Acequia*-finished except drainage issues and benches. Funding was available.
- *Colonial Prisma*- drawing and bid documents were ready; would be built with future dollars.
- *South Side Library*- finished except for the fountain feature.
- *Frenchy's Field* –Finished; the storage structure to be in the parking lot was drawing ready.

Mr. Coriz entered the meeting at this time.

- *Pueblo Del Sol*- Trails would be finished by month's end.
- *MRC* -the next major improvement would be issues with the parking lot at the soccer field. The designated parking spaces, traffic flow etc. would be done in house in the winter and start in the next couple of weeks. Irrigation and concession stand were complete.
- *Northwest Quadrant* –meetings were going on with BMX and the trails. Improvements hadn't started other than to secure the perimeter; bond money was used last year at the southern part of Northwest Quadrant to fence off because of access and security issues. Gates would be put on the east end at the trailheads and bollards would be placed to keep vehicles out.

Tom Agard entered the meeting at this time.

Mr. Bryan Brigham was recognized from the public who said he represented soccer.

A quorum was established at this time and Chair Booth returned to Approval of the Minutes.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES-September 21, 2010

The following changes were made to the minutes:

Page 2, #1- Villa Linda Park-completed.

#2, the soccer fields were reseeded, not renovated.

#3-the trail was from the Trail Bond Budget.

#4 and #5 and #6-the park furniture, and playground equipment and a safety audit were proposed items.

Page2, Pueblos del Sol- third paragraph, "He said they made the trail meander to get less than"...should state it was 5% grade on the spine trail and 8% on the feeder trail.

Page 3, Las Estancias, second sentence, third line- should state parks staff "brought the designs to the park" and delete the word *commission*. The statement "she noted there were two HOAs associated with the neighborhood" should be deleted; the statement referred to a different park.

Page 4-Martin Luther King- last sentence, "He said all of the....should state: "trees and shrubs in the park are on an automatic irrigation system."

Under Herb Martinez- First line should say the La Resolana Park...is on the backside of Herb Martinez and the sentence: Herb Martinez was on the backside of MLK -should be deleted.

Under Herb Martinez, should read "Chair Booth said the Master Plan called for installing picnic tables and..."

Page 7, Gregory Lopez- "the committee complimented the city for their work on this park ..." which was in bad shape" should be deleted. The comment was about another park. The next paragraph "Mr. Gurule said the park had ... which is controlled from his office- should be changed to "which is controlled from the Parks Division main office."

The last sentence under Gregory Lopez: "Mr. Gurule said they spent a lot of money on seeding the park ... should be deleted and referred to another park.

Page 9, Salvador Perez-first sentence, last paragraph "Mr. Gurule said the patio... and can be rented for parties at about...should be \$195.00."

Page 10, *Power Plant Park* the first sentence, "Mr. Gurule talked about the River Parkway"... referred to the area west of Delgado Street.

Mr. Torres moved to approve the minutes of September 21, 2010 as amended. Ms. Veneklasen seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

October 19, 2010

Page 3, second line- "Chair Booth offered to assist putting it on Monkey...should say Monkey Survey.

Page 9, Mr. Lehm talked about a drag rail actually should be grind rail.

Page 11, third paragraph, regarding prairie dogs, "she said there was a very vocal group, should be a very small group.

Ms. Veneklasen move to approve the minutes of October 19, 2010 as amended. Mr. Torres seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Ms. Taylor moved to approve the Agenda as presented. Mr. Torres seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous voice vote.

OLD BUSINESS (continued)

- Priority Recommendations for Parks, Open Space, Trails and Recreational Facilities Planning Process: Action Item

Chair Booth explained that the Commission would plan how to present recommendations and prioritize for the new bond. She added that Ms. Veneklasen would now be a Senior Technical Advisor.

Chair Booth said the new assignment involved a lot of time and the members should consider that; the commitment was larger than what most committee or commission members were asked.

She asked Mr. Chavez to review his process for the new parks.

Mr. Chavez said two resolutions were passed; the first directed Katherine Raveling and the Finance Staff to determine how more money could be raised for parks.

The second resolution asked for POSA (Parks and Open Spaces Advisory Commission), BTAC (Bicycle Trails Advisory Committee) and any facilities, commissions and boards to identify and prioritize

two things: 1- park projects that were underfunded or 2- things that were not done or missed in the 2008 Parks Bond and Staff would add the cost.

Mr. Chavez said that Councilor Rosemary Romero amended the resolution to involve the RPA (Regional Planning Authority) whose members consisted of both County and the City.

Mr. Chavez said he had Ms. Esparza create documents (Exhibit 1) so all of the groups could work together. He reviewed the documents and explained the process and how to fill in the categories and list the improvements. He provided examples.

He said the list should be prioritized and Staff would add the cost. He said the list should be completed by May because the resolution required completion in nine months. He said that gave Staff a month to six weeks for clean up and allowed six weeks to get the documents to the Governing Body and time for their questions and changes.

Chair Booth said she would get a list of all of the parks by district. Special situations like Tierra Contenta, the Skate Park/BMX, disc golf etc. should have public input meetings. Councilor Rosemary Romero offered to assist with facilitation.

Mr. Chavez said Commission members wouldn't see everything that was needed like the engineering, utilities and ADA issues that the supervisors would and a meeting with the supervisors would be helpful and efficient. He said Commission members could see the park afterward.

Mr. Chavez suggested their information be sent to Ms. Esparza as they listed items and she would build a database and send back updated information electronically each month.

Mr. Chavez said Mr. Agard should take the regional parks because of the user group input that was needed from soccer, YAFL, softball, skaters, bikers, etc. on what they knew was incomplete.

Ms. Veneklasen said she wasn't able to give that amount of time.

Chair Booth asked members their thoughts on the process.

Mr. Torres said he thought he could work with ten parks or so. He said he had no preference and could be placed where needed.

Mr. Coriz said he would definitely do the skate parks and (BMX) track trails and a few parks could be added. He agreed he would be in on the meeting for District 1. He said he counted 8 different locations with facilities that had BMX and skate parks.

Ms. Taylor said District 2 had the fewest parks and several were renovated in the past bond. She thought her district was doable.

Mr. Agard said the sports leagues had a punch list and had a good sense of what was needed already. He said a lot of work had been done on the regional parks and he thought it would be a matter of filling in the holes. He said he would look at District 4; it had a lot of parks.

Mr. Agard said he wasn't sure a survey was needed or that the Commission would get the outcome they wanted.

Chair Booth said the Commission wanted the league's input on the parks and however Mr. Agard thought best was fine. She said the idea of having the presenters was to understand what their needs were and this process would jumpstart that.

Chair Booth said Ms. Guerrerortiz was very busy and she would contact her later. She said Mr. Lehm was in District 1 and could do that district and the skate parks. She said she wanted to meet with the Staff before Christmas to have the first draft around February.

Chair Booth said she had a list of parks that weren't included the last time. Mr. Chavez said the Parks Advisory Book contained all of the parks and the missing parks could be updated and sent out to the members.

Mr. Chavez said the Commission could be told of gaps via phone or email. He said once the list of who would do what was decided; he would facilitate one meeting with the supervisors before the Christmas holidays. He said some things had to be after the holidays because of Staff leave that had to be used.

The Commission members discussed the next meeting and how to schedule time with the supervisors.

Mr. Chavez said one of the last things addressed by the resolution was things that were done, those left undone and the maintenance of. He said he wasn't sure how that would be addressed because the bond money couldn't be used for recurring expenses.

Mr. Chavez reviewed the Parks Organization Chart and positions. He said two supervisor positions were vacant and two maintenance positions and an equipment operator position were frozen. He said the Parks Department received four people when the Commission first formed and no one had been hired since. The division was down 15 full and temporary people.

Ms. Taylor suggested that be on a task list and sent with the wish list. She said it doesn't do any good to spend money if there weren't people to maintain the parks.

Chair Booth suggested a meeting be planned around a maintenance issue. Mr. Chavez added it should be before March because he had to develop the following year's budget.

Chair Booth confirmed the commitments from the Commissioners:

Mr. Coriz would do District 1 and BMX and skate parks.

Ms. Taylor- District 2

Mr. Agard-the regional parks and he would work with Mr. Coriz on the skateboarding.

Mr. Agard added he would look at District 4 and had names he could submit of people who could help. He suggested a bimonthly meeting during the process.

Ms. Taylor agreed the Commission should meet more often but said December wasn't realistic. She suggested the bimonthly meetings start in January or February.

Chair Booth said she could work with Ms. Hansen in District 3 and would talk with Ms. Guerrerortiz (District 3.)

The Commission decided not to do the survey. No action was needed.

- Youth Sports Survey: Action Item - Previously discussed.

NEW BUSINESS

There was none.

REPORTS:

- Tom Agard: Organized Youth Sports and Survey / Workforce Development / Trails to Schools

Safe Routes to School- Mr. Agard said the kids gathered at Candelero Park and played football etc. and then everyone walked to school.

Mr. Agard said Little League was getting ready for registration and meeting regularly. He said their input of what was needed would be easy because he saw them often.

- Jessie Esparza: Community Gardens

Ms. Esparza said someone wanted to join the garden at Frenchy's. She asked if there would be more domos (?) first.

Mr. Torres said an initial meeting with the community garden domo's would be a good way to start and then a meeting with each community garden for members to discuss their needs. He said after the holidays, each community garden could have a specific work day and he could visit with the groups at their locations every other month.

Ms. Taylor thought gardeners would be thrilled to have a County extension person interested in their plot and suggested Mr. Torres visit the gardeners at their plots.

- Daniel Coriz: NW Quadrant / BMX

Mr. Coriz said focused group meetings were scheduled at the Northwest Quadrant with Emily Oxford who worked on the master plan, for people to voice their needs.

Mr. Coriz shared pictures of skate parks and skate *plazas* to illustrate the difference between the two. He said the Skate Park was all transition with a slab of concrete bowls and quarter pipes; a Skate Plaza was small ledges with barriers like planters and looked more like a street plaza. He said a skate plaza in the downtown old skate park would be better because most kids found that more appealing.

- Joe Lehm- Bike paths and connections / Skate Parks

Chair Booth said she had interesting talks with the Santa Fe Community College Skateboarder Club and challenged them about what they needed.

Chair Booth said she and Mr. Chavez would meet with Mr. Drypolcher. She wanted to ensure the park would be closed once. She said everyone was on the same page that it should look like a skate plaza.

Mr. Coriz suggested small skate features at random parks. He explained grind ledges and said basically they looked like benches and the boarders or bikers would ride on them.

Chair Booth said she understood the crack fixed at DeVargas had broken out. She said that fed into the idea that DeVargas should be started over.

Mr. Coriz said on all of the cracks had been beveled and filled but none were flat; the cracks were better but still not up to grade.

- Patrick Torres: Community Gardens /Tree City

Mr. Torres said at the last Tree City Committee meeting Mr. Wood was asked what he needed help with. Mr. Wood asked that the Parks Commission ask for Tree City to be a line item in the budget.

Mr. Torres said he and Ms. Taylor agreed. He asked the Commission's support in resolution or letter form that requested that.

Mr. Wood explained he currently used Mr. Chavez's budget from other items and those items were left short.

Mr. Chavez suggested sub categories for the line items with x amount of money for trees, conferences, professional services, etc.

Chair Booth asked that they work together and advise her when an action item was needed, so it could be publicized.

- Sandra Taylor: Ten Park Histories on the Portal / Tree City

Ms. Taylor said showed pictures of Gregory Lopez, the oldest of five boys who was murdered at 15 years old in the 1970's. She said the park was named after Mr. Lopez nine years later. A resolution was passed in 1977 and the park was rededicated in 1978.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Ryan Lawless and Pete Gardini said they worked to get skate parks built in Santa Fe and were working with Chair Booth.

Mr. Gardini said Franklin Miles Park had extra concrete added and they loved it but already it was getting packed. He said they wanted to renovate and resize Franklin Miles Park to have creative lines and a designated area for spectators.

Mr. Gardini said they wanted to pave where the mulch was. He said Mr. Chavez mentioned a bone yard where things were thrown away that could be used as obstacles with alteration. He said everyone wanted the 599 Park and new, but this was perfect short term.

Chair Booth said the recommendation for short term was to extend the concrete into the mulch area that was now dead space.

Mr. Chavez said anything done had to be in-house at Franklin Miles Park because there was no money. He said he would meet with them and the supervisor of Franklin Miles Park to measure the area and then ensure lines weren't running underneath, etc. He said they could choose from the scrap yard what they wanted and he would get approval from risk management.

Mr. Chavez said the next step was to scope the work on paper to know exactly what was needed and he would get it designed. He thought a few square feet at a time could be done.

Chair Booth asked that she, Mr. Lehm and Mr. Coriz be told when they planned to meet.

DATE AND TIME FOR NEXT MEETING:

The next meeting date was discussed.

Chair Booth said she wanted to have a meeting with the supervisors between now and the holidays.


The commission discussed the meeting with the supervisors.

The Commission decided the December meeting would be a one hour meeting after the holiday luncheon.

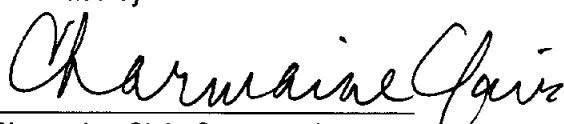

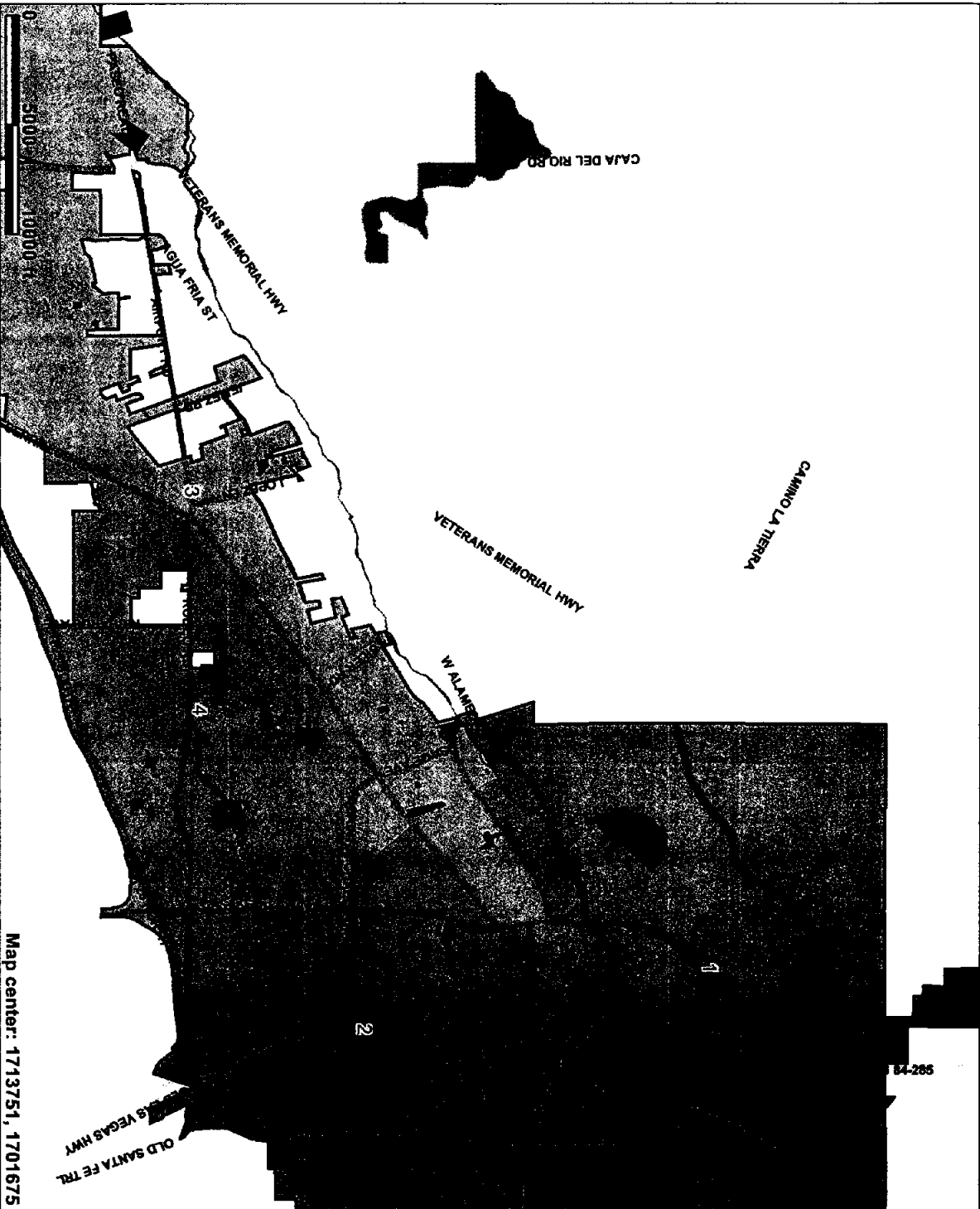
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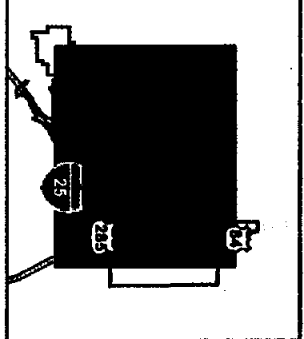


Parks in Council Districts
