Gonzales 5 Councilor Peter Ives 6 Councilor Patti Bushee 7 8 9 A RESOLUTION 10 DESIGNATING THE GREATER SANTA FE FIRE SHED AS AN AREA THAT IS 11 CRITICAL TO THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF THE CITIZENS OF SANTA FE AND 12 A PRIORITY IN REDUCING THE ECOLOGICAL AND ECONOMIC HAZARDS 13 POSED BY WILDFIRES; INCLUDING THE GREATER SANTA FE FIRE SHED IN 14 THE 25-YEAR SUSTAINABLE SANTA FE PLAN; AND DIRECTING STAFF TO 15 IDENTIFY FUNDING SOURCES TO DEVELOP PROJECTS. 16 17 WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe receives roughly 40% of its drinking water from a 18 forested watershed that is dominated by vegetation both adapted to wildfire and also at risk from 19 20 high-intensity wildfire; and WHEREAS, the health and safety of the citizens of Santa Fe are dependent on healthy 21 forests and watersheds for a sustainable source of drinking water; and 22 WHEREAS, the economy of the City of Santa Fe is connected to the natural amenities 23 that abut the city, largely on public lands managed by the Santa Fe National Forest, that are also 24

dominated by vegetation both adapted to wildfire, and at risk from high-intensity wildfire; and

WHEREAS, the economy of the City of Santa Fe is dependent on scenic vistas, access to nearby forested trails and streams on public lands, access to Hyde Memorial State Park, picnic areas and scenic overlooks, and access to a successful downhill ski area; and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned elements of the Santa Fe economy are at high risk from uncharacteristic high-intensity wildfire and subsequent floods and debris flows; and

WHEREAS, the Greater Santa Fe Fire Shed affects City, County, State, Tribal, and Federal jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe adopted resolution 2010-75, strongly supporting wilderness designation for the inventoried road-less areas which are adjacent to the Pecos Wilderness and

WHEREAS, designated wilderness areas require special consideration and evaluation regarding active management and wildfire response; and

WHEREAS, coordination, collaboration, and cooperation between public, private, and non-profit groups have been shown to gain greater public support when working together; and

WHEREAS, the Sustainable Santa Fe Commission has been charged with developing and drafting a 25-Year Sustainability Plan that will benefit the environment and people of Santa Fe, and the Greater Santa Fe Fire Shed is an important part of that plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that the City establish the Greater Santa Fe Fire Shed, shown on the attached Exhibit A, as a high priority area in need of fire risk reduction techniques such as thinning, and prescribed and managed fire.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Greater Santa Fe Fire Shed also be included in the 25-Year Sustainability. Plan to identify the programs, policies and projects to make the landscape more resilient to wildfire, drought, pests and pathogens, and climate change so that the City will work together with the many affected public, private and non-profit partners

1	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that staff is directed to seek out and identify funding
2	sources necessary to fund projects pursuant to the goals of the Greater Santa Fe Fire Shed.
