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5 AN ORDINANCE

6 AMENDING SECTION 21-2.1 SFCC 1987 TO AMEND EXISTING DEFINITIONS;
7 AMENDING SECTION 21-3 TO DELETE SANTA FE HOMES PROGRAM
8 APPLICABILITY; AMENDING SECTION 21-4.3 TO CLARIFY THE CONDITIONS OF
9 SERVICE FOR RESIDENTIAL COLLECTION; AMENDING SECTION 21-6 TO
10 CLARIFY CONDITIONS OF SERVICE; AMENDING SECTION 21-7.1 TO CLARIFY
11 THAT NONRESIDENTIAL ESTABLISHMENTS SHALL PAY A SERVICE RATE; AND
12 AMENDING *EXHIBIT B* OF SECTION 21 TO INCREASE RATES FOR RESIDENTIAL
13 CURBSIDE COLLECTION AND FOR COMMERCIAL RECYCLING IN ORDER TO
14 PURCHASE NECESSARY EQUIPMENT TO TRANSITION THE RESIDENTIAL
15 RECYCLING PROGRAM FROM MANUAL TO AUTOMATED COLLECTION.

17 Section 1. Subsection 21-2 SFCC 1987 (being Ord. #1996-46 (as amended)) is
18 amended to read:

19 21-2 DEFINITIONS.

20 21-2.1 Definitions.

21 As used in this section:

22 *Ashes* means residue from the burning of wood, coal, or other combustible materials.

23 *Automated* means refuse or recycled material collection by a truck with a hydraulically
24 operated, articulated arm, or cart tipper.

25 *Backyard composting* means composting household solid waste in a confined space

1 within personal property boundaries.

2 *Burning* means any form of incineration of solid waste.

3 *City* means the city of Santa Fe, Santa Fe County, New Mexico.

4 *Collection* means the systematic and regular removal of solid waste or recycling from
5 property and its transport to a designated solid waste facility.

6 *Commercial recycling* (see "nonresidential recycling").

7 *Commercial solid waste* (see "nonresidential solid waste").

8 *Compost* means organic matter produced from solid waste which has undergone a
9 controlled process of decomposition and pathogen reduction, and has been stabilized to a degree
10 which is potentially beneficial to plant growth and which is used as a soil amendment, growing
11 medium amendment or other similar uses.

12 *Composting* means the process by which compost is created.

13 *Construction and demolition debris (C & D)* means non-hazardous, uncontaminated
14 materials resulting from the construction, remodeling, repair, and demolition of structures,
15 utilities, and roads. C & D materials are generally considered water insoluble and non-hazardous
16 and include, but are not limited to: bricks, concrete, and other masonry materials, asphalt, roofing
17 materials, steel, glass, pipe, gypsum wallboard and lumber. C & D debris does not include
18 asbestos, garbage, corrugated container board, electrical fixtures containing hazardous liquids
19 such as fluorescent light ballasts or transformers, fluorescent lights, furniture, appliances, tires,
20 drums, containers greater than ten (10) gallons in size, any containers having more than one inch
21 (1") of residue remaining on the bottom, fuel tanks, brush and tree remains or other vegetative
22 material from land clearing, uncontaminated soil, rocks, liquids including, but not limited to,
23 waste paints, solvents, sealers, adhesives or potentially hazardous materials. If C & D debris is
24 mixed with any other types of solid waste, whether or not originating from the construction
25 project, it loses its classification as C & D debris.

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Container means:

A. City-provided or customer-owned receptacle that is designed for intermediate storage of solid waste and has a secure closing so as to prohibit animal destruction until such time refuse is collected; and

B. City-provided or customer-owned receptacles designed for the intermediate storage of recyclable materials.

Corrugated cardboard (OCC) means wood pulp based Kraft paper material which has two (2) usually smooth exterior layers, with one (1) wavy corrugated interior core, used to make cardboard boxes, shipping containers and packing liners. Also includes brown Kraft paper bags, and paper. Does not include wax-coated cardboard, cardboard with permanently attached packing materials, or cardboard contaminated with food or oils.

Customer, also user means residential or nonresidential persons who receive solid waste or recycling collection service from the city of Santa Fe.

Day means calendar day unless otherwise described.

Debris means the unwanted or unusable remains of something broken down or destroyed.

Dumping means:

A. Disposing of solid waste or any other discarded material on property within the city which is private including but not limited to privately owned or controlled containers, parking lots and vacant lots;

B. Disposing of solid waste or discarding any other items on a public place or on public property or facility which shall include, but is not limited to, the entire width between the boundary lines of every way publicly maintained for the purpose of vehicular travel or in public containers not intended for that purpose; or

C. Allowing refuse to collect or accumulate on any privately-owned lot or other premises within the city of Santa Fe.

1 *Facility* means real estate or buildings used for a particular function.

2 *Finance committee* means the designated standing committee of the governing body.

3 *Garbage* means unwanted or unusable waste products or unused materials to include, but
4 not limited to, food, offal, ashes, waste paper, trash, rubbish, and waste or unwholesome materials
5 generated during the consumption of resources.

6 *Governing body* means the governing body of the city of Santa Fe.

7 *Green waste, including yard waste*, means vegetative or green organic matter resulting
8 from landscaping, land maintenance and land clearing operations, but does not include dirt, rocks,
9 asphalt or concrete chips.

10 *Hazardous waste* means waste which because of its concentration or physical, chemical
11 or infectious characteristics may pose a substantial present or potential hazard to human health or
12 the environment when improperly treated, stored, transported, disposed of or otherwise managed.

13 *Hot waste* means any waste which is on fire or smoldering.

14 *Household hazardous waste (HHW)* means a wide range of household products,
15 including pesticides and herbicides, oil based paints, liquid latex paints, stains and varnishes,
16 automobile fluids (antifreeze, motor oil, transmission, steering and brake fluids, gasoline),
17 batteries (automotive and household), pool chemicals, hobby chemicals, darkroom chemicals,
18 which have the characteristics of hazardous waste when discarded. Federal law specifically
19 exempts household hazardous waste from regulation as hazardous waste because of the point of
20 generation. Because of the hazards posed by these wastes, they should not be placed in with solid
21 waste for disposal. See special waste.

22 *Household medical waste* means household solid waste which, but for its point of
23 generation, would be a regulated medical waste (i.e. used sharps including hypodermic needles,
24 bloody/soiled bandages and dressings, disposable sheets and clothing, medical gloves, dialysis
25 machine filters, etc.).

1 *Infectious waste* means regulated medical waste. A limited class of substances that carry
2 a probability risk of transmitting disease to humans, including but not limited to:

3 A. Microbiological laboratory wastes, including cultures and stocks of
4 infectious agents from clinic research and industrial laboratories, and disposable culture
5 dishes and devices used to transfer, inoculate and mix cultures;

6 B. Pathological wastes, including human or animal tissues, organs and body
7 parts removed during surgery, autopsy or biopsy;

8 C. Disposable equipment, instruments, utensils, and other disposable
9 materials which require special precautions because of contamination by highly
10 contagious diseases;

11 D. Human blood and blood products, including waste blood, blood serum,
12 and plasma;

13 E. Used sharps, including used hypodermic needles, syringes, scalpel
14 blades, Pasteur pipettes; and

15 F. Contaminated animal carcasses, body parts and bedding, especially those
16 intentionally exposed to pathogens in research, in the production of biological or in the
17 "in vivo" testing of pharmaceuticals.

18 *Multi-family residential* means sixteen (16) or more dwelling units on one (1) lot. A
19 dwelling unit is defined as one (1) room, or rooms connected together, constituting a separate,
20 independent housekeeping establishment for owner occupancy, or rental or lease, and physically
21 separated from any other rooms or dwelling units that may be in the same structure, and
22 containing independent cooking and sleeping facilities.

23 *Non-recyclable material* means items that are not recyclable or recyclables that are not
24 accepted within the city's recycling program including, but not limited to, ceramics, pyrex, plate
25 glass, light bulbs, drinking glasses, clothing, electronics, green waste, styrofoam, food waste,

1 food contaminated materials, or plastic bags, municipal solid waste, sharps, hazardous containers
2 or construction and demolition waste. The city reserves the right to modify this list as part of the
3 city's recycling program.

4 *Nonresidential recyclables*, also *commercial recyclables* means recyclables generated by
5 stores, offices, restaurants, hotels or motels, warehouses, and other manufacturing and non-
6 manufacturing activities; multi-family residential units; places of religious assembly; schools; and
7 government facilities.

8 *Nonresidential solid waste*, also *commercial solid waste* means all types of solid waste
9 generated by, but not limited to: businesses including stores, offices, restaurants, hotels or motels,
10 warehouses, and other manufacturing and non-manufacturing activities; multi-family residential
11 units; places of religious assembly; schools and governmental facilities, excluding household and
12 hazardous solid wastes.

13 *Ordinance* means Chapter XXI of the Santa Fe City Code.

14 *Person* means any individual, partnership, limited partnership, firm, company,
15 corporation, association, joint stock company, trust, estate, governmental entity, or any other legal
16 entity, or their legal representatives, agents or assignees. This definition includes all federal, state
17 or local governmental entities.

18 *Processing* means techniques to change the physical, chemical or biological character or
19 components of solid waste, which does not include composting.

20 *Prohibited materials* means solid wastes listed as special waste by New Mexico Solid
21 Waste Management Regulations 20 NMAC 9.1 700-711; or any items listed herein that can cause
22 operational problems, damage to equipment, health risks to workers, adverse impacts to the
23 environment, or any other solid waste that is listed that are not deemed acceptable for disposal or
24 recycling

25 A. Asbestos wastes, solid or friable;

- 1 B. Ammunition or any items that have the ability to explode or cause injury
2 when run over by heavy equipment and/or when exposed to an ignition source;
- 3 C. Animal wastes – horse, cattle and large animal manures and animal
4 bedding mixed with large animal wastes;
- 5 D. Automobiles and large automobile parts, automobile or equipment lead-
6 acid batteries, automobile parts containing or that contained fluids or liquids (gasoline
7 tanks). Does not include tire rims that have been removed from tires;
- 8 E. Dead animals;
- 9 F. Explosives, fireworks, ammunition or any items that have the ability to
10 explode or ignite when exposed to an ignition source;
- 11 G. Hazardous waste, as defined in this section;
- 12 H. Hot ashes, as defined in this section;
- 13 I. Regulated medical waste (infectious waste) from hospitals, clinics,
14 nursing homes, health maintenance organizations, doctor and dentist offices, blood
15 plasma centers, laboratories, veterinary practices and hospitals or as specified in 20
16 NMAC 9.1 (706);
- 17 J. Concrete, roofing materials, asphalt or rock;
- 18 K. Liquids including sewage and septage and large quantities of frying fats
19 and oils;
- 20 L. Petroleum or chemically contaminated soils;
- 21 M. Pressurized cylinders;
- 22 N. Radioactive waste;
- 23 O. Sewage, septage and holding tank pumping;
- 24 P. Sludges; or
- 25 Q. Any other item as specified by federal, state or local regulation.

1 *Putrescible* means organic material subject to decomposition by microorganisms.

2 *Recyclable materials* means materials that would otherwise be solid waste and which can
3 be collected, separated and/or processed, treated, reclaimed, and placed back in use in the form of
4 raw materials, or that can beneficially be used or reused, including:

5 Corrugated cardboard and brown Kraft paper bags;

6 Mixed papers (newspapers as delivered, magazines, glossy catalogs, glossy
7 paper, office paper, junk mail);

8 Mixed containers (steel food containers, aluminum cans, aluminum pie plates and
9 used foil balls, and plastics 1 through 7, (excluding styrofoam and plastic bags);

10 Glass food and beverage containers all colors;

11 Other containers, materials and papers not listed herein that may be determined
12 to be recyclable in the future, or for which economically viable markets exist or that are
13 created.

14 *Recycling* means any process by which recyclable materials are collected, separated and
15 processed and reused or returned to use in the form of raw materials or products.

16 *Refuse* (see "solid waste").

17 *Refuse and Recycling Rate and Fee Schedule* means the listing of fees and charges for
18 solid waste and recycling collection, transport and disposal services provided by the city and
19 which is incorporated as part of this chapter as Exhibit B.

20 *Refuse bag* means a city provided or customer owned disposable plastic bag used for the
21 intermediate storage of solid waste which shall be 1.5 mil thick and thirty-three (33) gallon
22 capacity.

23 *Residential solid waste* means any solid waste or garbage derived from households not
24 defined as multi-family residential and home occupations, as set forth in Chapter 14 SFCC 1987
25 and licensed by the city.

1 *Residential unit* means a dwelling unit. Where nonresidential and residential uses occur
2 in a single unit, that unit shall be considered nonresidential.

3 *Scavenging* means the removal of any solid waste or recyclables from privately or
4 publicly owned solid waste containers, refuse bags, solid waste facility, transfer station or
5 recycling container in a manner not authorized by the city.

6 *Service area* means that area within the corporate limits of the city of Santa Fe and any
7 additional area beyond those limits within which the governing body authorizes the collection of
8 solid waste.

9 *Solid waste* means garbage, refuse, litter, yard waste, white goods, construction and
10 demolition debris and other discarded solid materials, including those from industrial,
11 commercial and agricultural operations and from community activities but does not include
12 prohibited materials, solids or dissolved materials in domestic sewage or other significant
13 pollutants in water resources, such as silt, dissolved or suspended solids in industrial wastewater
14 effluents, dissolved materials in irrigation return flow nor materials which the city is prohibited
15 by law from accepting.

16 *Solid waste enterprise fund* means the fund created by the city of Santa Fe to manage [~~for~~
17 ~~dealing with~~] the revenues and expenses associated with the collection, diversion, transport and
18 disposal of solid waste and recycled materials including but not limited to operations, capital
19 improvements and debt service.

20 *Solid waste facility* means a facility that is permitted or registered by the state of New
21 Mexico and appropriately zoned and approved by the city to accept solid waste or recyclables.
22 Solid waste facilities include convenience centers, transfer stations, material recovery facilities,
23 composting facilities and landfills.

24 *Trash* (see "solid waste").

25 *User* (see "customer").

1 *White goods* means large household appliances such as refrigerators, stoves, washing
2 machines, air conditioners, swamp coolers and the like that are received as waste by the city.

3 *Yard waste* (see "green waste").

4 **Section 2. Subsection 21-3 SFCC 1987 (being Ord. #1996-46 (as amended)) is**
5 **amended to read:**

6 **21-3 COLLECTION AUTHORITY; ENTERPRISE FUND**
7 **ESTABLISHED.**

8 **21-3.1 Refuse Collection Authority.**

9 A. The city and its duly authorized agents or employees shall have the exclusive
10 right within the service area to collect or gather solid waste, with the exception of nonresidential
11 recyclables, dead animals, construction and demolition debris, hazardous wastes and other such
12 materials which the city is prohibited by law from collecting or disposing. No person or
13 organization may sell within the service area any services for the systematic and routine
14 collection, transportation or disposal of garbage, trash or refuse except for nonresidential
15 recyclables, dead animals, construction and demolition debris, hazardous wastes and other such
16 materials which the city is prohibited by law from collecting or disposing.

17 B. The city and its duly authorized agents shall have the exclusive right to collect or
18 gather residential curbside recyclables.

19 C. The city reserves the right at any time to refuse to collect or receive waste, if, in
20 the judgment of the city, such collection is deemed to be harmful, hazardous or in violation of
21 city or state regulations governing type of waste, weight or waste constituents. The city shall
22 inform the person responsible for such waste and shall require compliance with this chapter.

23 **21-3.2 Establishment of Solid Waste Enterprise Fund.**

24 For the purpose of defraying all expenses of collection, diversion, transport and disposal
25 of refuse, the solid waste enterprise fund is established. The governing body shall establish and

1 periodically amend service rates and charges which recover the full costs for each class of service
2 rendered. The revenue received from these rates shall be credited to the solid waste enterprise
3 fund. Money from this fund shall pay all direct, indirect and bond service expenses of the solid
4 waste management operation. All refuse services provided by the city are subject to the Refuse
5 and Recycling Rate and Fee Schedule of this chapter.

6 **21-3.3 Repealed.**

7 **Section 3. Subsection 21-4 SFCC 1987 (being Ord. #1996-46 (as amended)) is**
8 **amended to read:**

9 **21-4 REFUSE COLLECTION.**

10 **21-4.3 Conditions of Service - Residential Collection.**

11 A. For residential collection tag service the customer shall use commercially
12 available plastic refuse bags which are no greater than 33 gallons and have a maximum weight of
13 50 pounds. The customer shall place bags by the curb between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 8:00
14 a.m. of the day designated for collection.

15 B. For residential automated collection service, the size and mil of the bags in the
16 container are not mandated.

17 C. For residential automated recycling collection service, the customer shall place
18 all acceptable recycling materials within the automated container, with the exception of food and
19 beverage glass and all non-recyclable materials. (ceramics, Pyrex, plate glass, light bulbs,
20 drinking glasses, clothing, electronics, green waste, Styrofoam, food waste, food contaminated
21 materials, or plastic bags, municipal solid waste, sharps, hazardous containers or construction and
22 demolition waste). All food and beverage glass shall be recycled at designated drop off locations.

23 D. Customer shall keep all refuse and recycling within private property away from
24 public view until the time when containers are placed at the curbside for city collection. In order
25 to minimize garbage falling out upon collection and to keep containers clean, the city

1 recommends that all garbage be bagged inside a customer owned or city provided container. Bags
2 inside such containers are not required to meet any standard. Bags placed outside of a container
3 shall meet requirements in paragraph A. above.

4 E. Customers shall place city provided refuse containers and recycling containers by
5 curbside between the hours of 6:00 p.m. the night before the designated day of collection and
6 8:00 a.m. on the day designated for collection. Refuse containers and recycling containers shall
7 be removed from the curbside by 8:00 a.m. the day following the designated collection day.

8 F. Customers who receive automated collection shall place containers at a minimum
9 of three feet (3') from any other object (mailboxes, walls, parked vehicles, etc), including refuse
10 bags, and recycling containers so that personal property or city equipment do not get damaged, or
11 city collection personnel do not get injured. The customer shall place the container in an area
12 which does not have any overhead obstacles (trees, utility lines).

13 G. Where a curb does not exist, refuse containers shall be placed on the property
14 side, outside the traffic boundaries of the road. Carts shall be placed on a flat level surface. In
15 other special situations outside of those described herein, the location in which refuse is placed
16 for collection shall be determined by the city.

17 H. Bags shall be securely tied to avoid spillage. Cleaning of any spillage that occurs
18 within public right-of-way as a result of improperly bagged or secured refuse or due to entry by
19 animals shall be the responsibility of the customer.

20 I. Each refuse bag placed for collection shall not exceed fifty (50) pounds and shall
21 not exceed thirty-three (33) gallon capacity. City provided containers shall not exceed two
22 hundred (200) pounds in capacity.

23 J. Hypodermic needles shall be placed in a puncture proof container with a screw
24 top lid.

25 K. Items which do meet the conditions of this section shall remain the sole

1 responsibility of the customer to dispose in accordance with this chapter.

2 **Section 4. Subsection 21-6 SFCC 1987 (being Ord. #1996-46 (as amended)) is**
3 **amended to read:**

4 **21-6 REFUSE DIVERSION AND RECYCLING.**

5 **21-6.1 Waste Reduction and Recycling.**

6 The city shall promote the waste reduction and diversion to the maximum extent possible.
7 It shall implement diversion practices where feasible including but not limited to the collection of
8 recyclable materials from residential and nonresidential sources and safe disposal of household
9 waste which could include hazardous waste. (Ord. #1996-46, §7)

10 **21-6.2 Conditions of Service - Waste Reduction and Recycling.**

11 A. A list of materials recommended for recycling and recommended methods of
12 recycling shall be periodically updated by the city and the list shall be broadly distributed.

13 B. All food glass and beverage glass shall be recycled at designated drop off
14 locations. Locations for drop off shall be clearly identified, broadly publicized, and periodically
15 updated by the city.

16 C. Containers for recyclable materials shall be clearly identified and distinguishable
17 from containers used for waste collection.

18 D. Storage of recyclable materials prior to collection shall not create a nuisance or
19 condition which may adversely affect public health.

20 E. Recycling containers shall be placed on the curb at least three feet (3') from
21 refuse containers and refuse bags.

22 F. Backyard composting and related forms of biological waste diversion or
23 reduction shall be conducted in a manner that does not violate state or city laws or regulations and
24 does not create a nuisance or condition which may adversely affect public health.

25 G. For commercial recycling collection services, the business shall place all

1 acceptable recycling materials within either the rolling automated container or the recycling
2 dumpster, all acceptable materials may be mixed with the exception of food glass and beverage
3 glass and all non-recyclable materials (ceramics, Pyrex, plate glass, light bulbs, drinking glasses,
4 clothing, electronics, green waste, Styrofoam, food waste, food contaminated materials, or plastic
5 bags, municipal solid waste, sharps, hazardous containers, or construction and demolition waste).

6 H. For commercial glass recycling collection services, the business shall place only
7 food and beverage glass within a 64 gallon rolling container. The storage of recyclable materials
8 prior to collection shall not create a nuisance or condition which may adversely affect public
9 health.

10 **Section 5. Subsection 21-7 SFCC 1987 (being Ord. #1996-46 (as amended)) is**
11 **amended to read:**

12 **21-7 SERVICE RATES AND CHARGES**

13 **21-7.1 Service Fees and Charges.**

14 A. There is assessed against every person owning or controlling any developed
15 property in the city, monthly and other special refuse collection and disposal fees payable to the
16 city in accordance with the Refuse and Recycling Rate and Fee Schedule, hereby adopted by
17 reference and incorporated as part of this chapter as Exhibit B, and in accordance with service
18 rate classes described herein.

19 (1) There is a residential curbside service rate which shall apply to those
20 residential units having refuse collection at the curb. The monthly rate shall be in
21 accordance with the Refuse and Recycling Rate and Fee Schedule.

22 (2) There is a non-compacting rear-loading commercial service rate which
23 shall apply to nonresidential establishments having refuse collection at non-compacting
24 rear-loading bins or carts. The city shall provide and maintain non-compacting rear-
25 loading bins or carts at an indicated rental charge which shall be provided for in the

1 service rate. Bins and carts shall be placed for service in a manner and location
2 acceptable to the city. The monthly rate shall be in accordance with the Refuse and
3 Recycling Rate and Fee Schedule.

4 (3) There is a non-compacting rear-loading light commercial service rate
5 which shall apply to nonresidential establishments having refuse collection from not
6 larger than one (1) ninety (90) gallon cart and not more than one (1) service visit per
7 week. The city shall provide and maintain non-compacting rear-loading carts which shall
8 be provided for in the service rate. Carts shall be placed for service in a manner and
9 location acceptable to the city. The monthly rate shall be in accordance with the Refuse
10 and Recycling Rate and Fee Schedule.

11 (4) There is a non-compacting front-loading commercial service rate which
12 shall apply to nonresidential establishments having refuse collection at non-compacting
13 front-loading bins. The city shall provide and maintain non-compacting front-loading
14 bins at an indicated rental charge which shall be provided for in the service rate. Bins
15 shall be placed for service in a manner and location acceptable to the city. The monthly
16 rate shall be in accordance with the Refuse and Recycling Rate and Fee Schedule.

17 (5) There is a compacting front-loading commercial service rate which shall
18 apply to nonresidential establishments having refuse collection at compacting front-
19 loading bins. Such bins shall be provided, installed and maintained at customer expense
20 and shall be placed for service in a manner and location acceptable to the city. The
21 monthly rate shall be in accordance with the Refuse and Recycling Rate and Fee
22 Schedule.

23 (6) There is a non-compacting open top roll-off commercial service rate
24 which shall apply to any establishment having refuse collection from non-compacting,
25 open top roll-off bins. The non-compacting open top roll-off container shall be serviced a

1 minimum of one (1) time per month. Bins shall be placed for service in a manner and
2 location acceptable to the city. The gross weight including the weight of the bin and its
3 contents may not exceed twenty thousand (20,000) pounds and the external dimensions
4 of the bin shall be reviewed and approved by the city prior to the commencement of
5 service. The monthly rate shall be in accordance with the Refuse and Recycling Rate and
6 Fee Schedule. Persons wishing to substitute special on-call service in lieu of scheduled
7 service for a period of thirty (30) days or more shall be assessed on the basis of each
8 special service call provided by the city for each bin.

9 (7) There is a non-compacting, open top roll-off special event commercial
10 service rate which shall apply to any establishment requiring refuse collection at non-
11 compacting, open top roll-off bins for a special event or other use having a duration of
12 less than thirty (30) days. The service rate shall be in accordance with the Refuse and
13 Recycling Rate and Fee Schedule for special service under the commercial non-
14 compacting roll-off class of service. Bins shall be placed for service in a manner and
15 location acceptable to the city.

7 service rate. The city shall approve the placement site of the container. The monthly rate
8 shall be in accordance with the Refuse and Recycling Rate and Fee Schedule, Exhibit B
9 of this chapter.

10 (10) There is a residential, curbside, large-item collection rate which will
11 apply to on-call collection at curbside of items/materials that cannot be collected as
12 residential curbside collection due to weight or size restrictions. The fee for this service

14 collection fee includes the disposal cost of all items collected.

15 B. The city reserves the right at any time to refuse to remove materials placed for
16 city collection and disposal if, in the judgment of the city, the removal from the premises may be
17 harmful or hazardous or in violation of state or city regulations governing weight or contents. The
18 city shall inform the person responsible for the materials and shall allow the person to correct the
19 problem so as to allow removal by the city.



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
