Villarreal 8 Councilor Mike Harris 9 A RESOLUTION 10 ENCOURAGING CONGRESS TO CREATE A RELIABLE, PREDICTABLE STREAM OF 11 RESOURCES TO ADDRESS DEFERRED MAINTENANCE NEEDS IN AMERICA'S 12 NATIONAL PARK SYSTEM. 13 14 15 WHEREAS, America's National Park System is a living testament to our citizens valor, our 16 nation's hardships, our victories, and our traditions as Americans, and has been called "America's 17 Best Idea;" and WHEREAS, the National Park System preserves the diversity, culture, and heritage of all 18 19 Americans, and serves as a living classroom for future generations; and 20 WHEREAS, in 2016, the National Park Service is celebrating its centennial and currently manages 410 nationally significant sites and an invaluable collection of more than 75,000 natural and 21 cultural assets that span 84 million acres across all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and several 22 23 U.S. territories and insular areas; and 24 WHEREAS, New Mexico is home to 15 national park units, including Carlsbad Caverns National Park, Valles Caldera National preserve, as well as monuments like Petroglyph and White 25

Sands; and

WHEREAS, Santa Fe is a gateway community to both Pecos National Historical Park and Bandelier National Monument; and

WHEREAS, the National Park Service's mission is to "to conserve the scenery and the natural and historic objects and the wild life therein and to provide for the enjoyment of the same in such manner and by such means as will leave them unimpaired for the enjoyment of future generations;" and

WHEREAS, in 2015, the National Park System had more than 307 million visitors with 1.7 million of them enjoying national parks in New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, a recent report has shown that for every \$1 we invest in our national parks, there is a \$10 economic benefit to the local community; and

WHEREAS, national parks support over 275,000 direct and secondary jobs nationwide; and WHEREAS, in 2015, National Park Service estimates indicate that park visitors spent more than "\$97.5 million in New Mexico at the sites and local communities adjacent to national parks; and

WHEREAS, the National Park Service has the obligation to preserve our nation's history; promote access to national parks for all citizens; stimulate revenue to sustain itself and nearby communities; educate the public about America's natural, cultural and historical resources, and provide safe facilities and environs to enjoy these resources; and

WHEREAS, in 2016, the National Park Service estimated a deferred maintenance backlog of nearly \$12 billion, over \$113 million of which is needed in New Mexico which includes repairs to aging historical structures, trails, sewers, drainage, thousands of miles of roads, bridges, tunnels, and other vital infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, needed repairs in New Mexico include out-of-service elevators at Carlsbad Caverns, an outdated electrical system at Bandelier, deferred trail maintenance at Petroglyph National Monument and at the Pecos National Historic Park as well as other maintenance at Chaco Canyon, El

2	National Historical Park, Valles Caldera and White Sands; and
3	WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of Congress to maintain America's national parks to
4	ensure our natural places and our history is preserved and documented for future generations, and for
5	the adjacent communities that rely on the direct and indirect economic benefits generated by visits to
6	national park sites.
7	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE
8	CITY OF SANTA FE that the City of Santa Fe urges Congress to create a reliable, predictable
9	stream of resources to address deferred maintenance needs in America's National Park System.
10	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk is directed to forward a copy of this
11	resolution to the Secretary of the Interior, Director of the Office of Cabinet Affairs, President Pro
12	Tempore of the U.S. Senate, Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives and the New Mexico
13	Congressional delegation.
