Ives 8 9 10 A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE SANTA FE POLICE DEPARTMENT IMPLEMENT A POLICY OF 11 DESTRUCTION OF ALL FIREARMS IN POSSESSION OF THE POLICE 12 DEPARTMENT THAT ARE NO LONGER NECESSARY FOR USE IN OBTAINING A 13 CONVICTION, OR ARE NOT NEEDED FOR ANY OTHER PUBLIC PURPOSE. 14 15 WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe collected 174 firearms in 2015; and 16 17 WHEREAS, current Santa Fe Police Department policy allows for the "destruction or disposal of...firearms in accordance with applicable laws"; and 18 WHEREAS, Chapter 29-1-14(H) NMSA 1978 states that "[o]nce it is determined by the 19 20 law enforcement agency that any property enumerated in this subsection is no longer necessary 21 for use in obtaining a conviction or is not needed for any other public purpose, the law enforcement agency may apply to the district court...for an order authorizing destruction or other 22 23 disposition of the property..."; and 24 WHEREAS, it is the current policy of the Santa Fe Police Department to destroy all unclaimed and seized weapons in the possession of the Police Department; and 25

WHEREAS, the Santa Fe Police Department sponsored a gun buyback program in 2013 that brought in over 400 firearms, all of which were subsequently destroyed, taking many weapons off of our streets; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Governing Body to ensure that the Santa Fe Police Department destroys all firearms in its possession, when legally permissible, to ensure they do not return to our streets.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that the Santa Fe Police Department is requested to implement a policy that all firearms in the possession of the Santa Fe Police Department which are no longer necessary for use in obtaining a conviction, or are not needed for any other public purpose, shall be destroyed as permitted by state law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this request shall in no way conflict or contradict the provisions of the Second Amendment to the United States Constitution regarding the right to bear arms, or any other national, state or local law regulating that right.
