10	A RESOLUTION
11	IN SUPPORT OF FEDERAL EXECUTIVE ACTION AND FEDERAL LEGISLATION
12	TO KEEP UNLEASED FEDERAL FOSSIL FUELS IN THE GROUND.
13	
14	WHEREAS, scientific consensus is unequivocal that the global climate is warming;
15	warming is having widespread impacts on human and natural systems; warming is primarily due
16	to human-induced greenhouse gas emissions, in large part from burning fossil fuels; and warming
17	poses unprecedented threats to human and natural systems; and
18	WHEREAS, warming and climate change are already impacting New Mexico's human
19	and natural systems through increased temperatures, hotter and more severe droughts, decreased
20	river flows, and larger and more severe wildfires; and
21	WHEREAS, because further warming will exacerbate impacts to New Mexico's natural
22	and human environments at increasing costs to environmental, social, and economic values; and
23	WHEREAS, climate change, if unchecked, will continue to impact human health, natural
24	systems, and infrastructure, creating new costs for individuals, businesses, and governments; and
25	WHEREAS, local, regional and global economies are transitioning to clean energy

1	sources, and New Mexico businesses have the opportunity to lead in providing energy efficiency
2	and renewable energy technologies and services; and
3	WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe has an interest in federal and global policies that
4	reduce greenhouse gas emissions and minimize future climate change impacts; and
5	WHEREAS, in the December 2015 Paris Agreement under the United Nations
6	Framework Convention on Climate Change, the U.S. and nearly 200 other nations adopted the
7	goal of limiting global warming "to well below 2°C above pre-industrial levels and to pursue
8	efforts to limit the temperature increase to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels,"; and
9	WHEREAS, in order to meet that goal scientific studies show that greenhouse gas
10	pollution must be rapidly reduced and at least 80 percent of existing fossil fuels remain in the
11	ground; and
12	WHEREAS, federal fossil fuel leasing accounts for approximately 25 percent of all U.S.
13	and 3-4 percent of global fossil fuel greenhouse gas emissions; and
14	WHEREAS, federal fossil fuel leasing continues to expand fossil fuel reserves by
15	opening new fossil fuel deposits to exploration and development; and
16	WHEREAS, the global carbon budget necessary for preserving a 66% chance of limiting
17	global warming to below 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels is approximately 319 billion tons
18	carbon dioxide equivalent (319 GtCO ₂ e); and
19	WHEREAS, about half of all remaining U.S. potential greenhouse gas emissions from
20	fossil fuels 450 GtCO ₂ e are federally controlled and publicly owned and have not yet been
21	leased to private industry; and
22	WHEREAS, in 2015 over 67 million acres of federal fossil fuels were already leased to
23	the fossil fuel industry, representing up to 43 GtCO ₂ e of potential greenhouse gas pollution and
24	decades' worth of energy; and
25	WHEREAS, under existing authorities of the Mineral Leasing Act, the Federal Land

1	Management and Policy Act, the Outer Continental Shelf Lands Act and other laws, U.S.
2	presidents can cease new federal fossil fuel leasing and subsequent exploration on public lands
3	and oceans; and
4	WHEREAS, introduced federal legislation in the House and Senate known as the "Keep
5	It In The Ground Act" would cease new federal fossil fuel leasing and subsequent exploration on
6	public lands and oceans; and
7	WHEREAS, halting new federal leasing would remove the equivalent of up to 450
8	billion tons of greenhouse gases—up to half of the potential emissions from all remaining fossil
9	fuels in the U.S.—from the global pool of potential pollution; and
10	WHEREAS, executive action and federal legislation to cease new federal fossil fuel
11	leasing would demonstrate necessary global leadership in the fight to reduce greenhouse gas
12	emissions and avoid the worst impacts of climate change.
13	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE
14	CITY OF SANTA FE that the City of Santa Fe supports the following:
15	1. Federal executive action to halt new federal fossil fuel leasing; and
16	2. Federal legislation to halt new federal fossil fuel leasing; and
17	3. Encourages members of the New Mexico congressional delegation to co-sponsor,
18	promote and pass federal legislation to halt new federal fossil fuel leasing.
19	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk is directed to forward a copy of this
20	resolution to the New Mexico Congressional delegation.
