Dominguez 5 6 7 8 9 A RESOLUTION 10 AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION FOR PROJECT 11 APPROVAL TO THE NEW MEXICO STATE BOARD OF FINANCE FOR ALLOCATION 12 OF QUALIFIED ENERGY CONSERVATION BONDS TO BE USED IN THE EXPANSION 13 OF AN ENERGY EFFICIENCY LOAN PROGRAM ADMINISTERED BY HOMEWISE. 14 15 WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe is committed to protecting the long-term health and 16 viability of our community through strategies designed to improve the environment by reducing 17 greenhouse gas emissions and mitigating the effects of climate change; and 18 WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe is also committed to the advancement of its economy, 19 including jobs related to the field of sustainability; and 20 WHEREAS, electricity use by the citizens and businesses of Santa Fe is a major contributory 21 source of carbon emissions; and 22 WHEREAS, the Governing Body, through the adoption of Resolution No. 2015-30, directed 23 the City Renewable Energy Planner to develop a green community program and/or programs to 24 reduce energy and water consumption at city owned facilities and throughout the community at-large; 25

work with other City staff and environmental, energy, sustainability and other climate related stakeholders in the community to draft a comprehensive 25-year sustainability plan to annually reduce Santa Fe's carbon emissions and energy consumption through a variety of strategies in order to achieve the City's goal of becoming carbon neutral by 2040; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body, through the adoption of Resolution No. 2015-72, authorized and approved submission of an application for project approval to the New Mexico State Board of Finance for allocation of Qualified Energy Conservation Bonds (QECB) for the implementation of a green community program, energy performance contract, and other qualified conservation projects, and directing the City Manager and city staff to take necessary action in connection with the application to the New Mexico State Board of Finance;

WHEREAS, in 2015 the City of Santa Fe joined the Compact of Mayors, a worldwide coalition of cities dedicated to making progress on the reduction of greenhouse gases; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body, through the adoption of Resolution No. 2016-42, created the Verde Fund establishing the Verde Fund to reduce systemic poverty, achieve carbon neutrality and empower Santa Fe's workforce; and

WHEREAS, Homewise operates an Energy Efficiency Loan program to help families in Santa Fe County conserve energy and protect the value of their homes; and

WHEREAS, using capital from QECBs, Homewise will expand the Energy Efficiency Loan program and offer lower interest rates to help reach families at all income ranges including low- and moderate-income who would benefit the most from lower energy costs; and

WHEREAS, such energy efficiency loans finance projects that conserve resources like energy and water and generate energy through solar; and

WHEREAS, the Energy Efficiency Loan program advances the qualified conservation purpose of implementing a green community program through the use of loans to implement the program, and the loans enable homeowners at all income levels to finance capital improvements to

their homes that result in energy and water savings, and such improvements typically include items like solar photovoltaic system, solar hot water, new roofs with additional insulation, upgraded windows, upgraded heating and cooling systems, Energy Star appliances, and water efficient landscaping and irrigation; and

WHEREAS, the loan program is designed to specifically remove barriers that exist in the current marketplace that prevent homeowners from completing improvements, and such existing barriers are especially burdensome for low- and moderate-income homeowners who are on fixed monthly budgets and lack the liquid savings to pay for large projects up front.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that it directs city staff to work with Homewise to assist with an application to the New Mexico State Board of Finance to apply for QECBs to be used to create an energy loan program for the community.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the focus of the energy loan program shall include the following and subsequent deliverables:

- 1. The funds will be designated for renewable energy and energy efficiency work for home and small business owners;
- 2. Homewise would use the services of Modrall Sperling to initiate the bond;
- 3. Homewise shall create and submit semi-annual reports which will contain at a minimum: applicant, loan amount, project type, location, and term;
- 4. An independent third party shall be used to review and verify the semi-annual reports; and
- 5. The independent third party will work with Modrall Sperling to submit the required semiannual remittent reports.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that in the event that here is significantly more demand than funding available, then the applications of low-income persons – as determined under applicable federal, state or local law or regulation – shall be prioritized to the extent allowed under the law.
