6	AMENDING SUBSECTION 18-1.4 TO INCLUDE BUSINESSES SELLING GOODS
7	REPRESENTED AS NATIVE AMERICAN WITHIN THE NATIVE AMERICAN ARTS
8	OR CRAFTS DISTRICT; AND CREATING A NEW SUBSECTION 18-5.29 TO
9	ESTABLISH THE NATIVE AMERICAN ARTS OR CRAFTS DISTRICT, AND
10	ESTABLISHING REGULATIONS FOR SALE OF NATIVE AMERICAN ARTS OR
11	CRAFTS WITHIN THE DISTRICT.
12	
13	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE:
14	Section 1. Section 18-1 SFCC 1987 (being Ord. #1981-64 (as amended)) is
15	amended to read:
16	18-1 BUSINESS LICENSES.
17	18-1.4 License Application; Information Required.
18	A. Applicants for licenses under this section shall file with the city a sworn
19	application in writing, on a form to be furnished by the city, which shall include, but is not
20	limited to the following:
21	(1) Name;
22	(2) Address;
23	(3) Current state revenue division taxpayer identification number or
24	evidence of application for a current state revenue division taxpayer identification
25	number;

1	(4) A brief description of the nature of the business;
2	(5) Proof of insurance coverage, when applicable;
3	(6) Proof of bond, when applicable; and
4	(7) An attestation clause that states that the business shall comply with the
5	requirements of the Living Wage Ordinance, 28-1 SFCC 1987.
6	B. In addition to the information required in paragraph A, the following businesses
7	shall also include the following information with their applications:
8	(1) Carnival operators shall submit a copy of their special use permit, as
9	required by subsection 18-7.2 SFCC 1987;
10	(2) Circus operators shall submit a copy of their special use permit, as
11	required by subsection 18-7.2 SFCC 1987;
12	(3) Itinerant vendors seeking to conduct sales as defined under subsection
13	18-5.1 SFCC 1987 shall submit a copy of their petition as approved by the governing
14	body, as required in subsection 18-5.1 SFCC 1987;
15	(4) Jewelry auction operators, as defined in subsections 18-5.1 through 18-
16	5.23 SFCC 1987, shall provide information required by subsections 18-5.12 and 18-5.14
17	SFCC 1987, including a notarization of the application;
18	(5) Mobile home park operators shall submit a copy of their certificate of
19	occupancy;
20	(6) Private day-care nurseries, facilities and kindergarten operators, when
21	approval is required by the board of adjustment, as per the provisions of Table 14-6.1-1
22	SFCC 1987, shall include a sworn affidavit stating that they have received such approval;
23	and
24	(7) Septic tank cleaners shall submit a sworn affidavit stating that they have
25	conformed to the requirements set forth in subsection 22-4.9 SFCC 1987.

1	(8)	Flea market operators shall submit:
2		(a) A copy of a current certificate of occupancy. The certificate of
3	occupa	ancy shall be reissued annually; and
4		(b) A sworn affidavit stating that they have conformed to the
5	require	ements set forth in subsection 14-6.2(C) SFCC1987.
6	(9)	Alarm installation companies and monitoring companies, as defined in
7	subsection 20	-5.4 SFCC 1987, shall submit the following documents as required by
8	subsection 20-	5.8 SFCC 1987;
9		(a) A copy of a valid license issued by the construction industries
10	divisio	on of the regulation and licensing department of the state of New Mexico;
11	and	
12		(b) Proof of bonding.
13	(10)	Businesses who sell any item advertised as Native American arts or
14	crafts in the N	ative American Arts or Crafts district, as defined in subsection 18-5.29(A),
15	shall abide by	the provisions set forth in subsection 18-5.29.
16	Section 2.	A new subsection 18-5.29 SFCC 1987 is ordained to read:
17	18-5.29	Native American Arts or Crafts District
18	A. The N	Native American arts or crafts district ("district") covers all businesses
19	within an area bounde	d by Sandoval and Grant Streets on the west, Alameda Street on the south,
20	Paseo de Peralta on th	he east, and Marcy Street on the north and incorporates an additional area
21	bounded by Paseo de	Peralta on the west, East Palace Avenue on the north, East Alameda Street
22	and Camino del Monte	e Sol on the east, and Canyon Road and Acequia Madre Street on the south.
23	This area is shown in I	Exhibit A, which may be found at the end of this Chapter.
24	(1)	The term "Indian tribe" and "Indian" as defined in Section 30-33-4 NMSA
25	1978 shall, fo	r the purpose for this subsection, refer to Native American, and means any

1	person who is an enrolled member of a Native American tribe as evidenced by tribal
2	enrollment card or certified tribal records; or any person who can meet the minimum
3	qualifications for services offered by the United States government to Native Americans:
4	(a) any person who is an enrolled member of a Native American tribe
5	as evidenced by a tribal enrollment card or certified tribal records; or
6	(b) any person who can meet the minimum qualifications for services
7	offered by the United States government to Native Americans because of their
8	special status as Native Americans as evidenced by a certificate of degree of
9	Native American blood card;
10	(2) The term "authentic Indian arts or crafts" shall, for the purpose for this
11	subsection, refer to Native American arts or crafts, and means any products, including
12	traditional or contemporary Native American arts, that:
13	(a) are Native American handmade; and
14	(b) were produced after 1935; and
15	(b) are not made by machine; and
16	(c) are not imported replicas of Native American arts or crafts from
17	overseas/foreign countries.
18	(3) Businesses shall provide to the city the following information in order to
19	be permitted to sell Native American arts or crafts within the district:
20	(a) Business name, address and owner; and
21	(b) Written certification that the business shall comply with the
22	requirements of this subsection.
23	(4) Businesses shall be required:
24	(a) To display a Native American arts or crafts vendor sticker,
25	provided by the city, at the public entrance to the business; and

1	(b) Clearly display a disclosure for each article offered for sale a
2	statement that the article is "authentic Native American arts item" or "authentic
3	Native American crafts item", or otherwise claimed to be Native American
4	handmade, however phrased.
5	(c) At point of sale, clearly display, in the manner set forth by policy
6	and procedures established by the city manager, signage informing buyers of
7	their rights under both federal and state laws as it pertains to authentic Native
8	American arts or crafts items.
9	B. Businesses Outside the Native American Arts and Crafts District. Businesses
10	may voluntarily participate in the regulations for sale of Native American Arts and Crafts as set
11	forth in Subsection 18-5.29.
12	C. Revocation of Permit. The Native American arts or crafts vendor sticker shall be
13	revoked if the city manager finds the following:
14	(1) Violations of subsection 18-5.29(A)(2) above relating to authentic Native
15	American arts or crafts; or
16	(2) Failure to clearly display a disclosure of a statement that the article is
17	"authentic Native American arts item" or "authentic Native American crafts item", and
18	display signage informing buyers of their rights pursuant to Subsection 18-5.29(A)(3)(b)
19	above.
20	Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon
21	adoption.
