11	CALLING FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF SANTA FE ON
12	MAY 2, 2017, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING A QUESTION TO THE QUALIFIED
13	ELECTORS OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE TO VOTE FOR OR AGAINST THE
14	ESTABLISHMENT OF A SUGAR-SWEETENED BEVERAGE TAX, IN THE AMOUNT OF
15	TWO CENTS (\$.02) PER FLUID OUNCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUPPORTING EARLY
16	CHILDHOOD EDUCATION, PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 10, § 6(D) OF THE NEW MEXICO

19	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE:
20	Section 1. PURPOSE AND DATE OF ELECTION. A special municipal election
21	shall be held on May 2, 2017 for the purpose of voting for or against the imposition of a sugar-
22	sweetened beverage tax in the amount of two cents (\$.02) per fluid ounce of sugar-sweetened
23	beverage products.
24	Section 2. BALLOT QUESTION TO BE SUBMITTED. The following question
25	shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the City of Santa Fe:

ELECTION QUESTION

Establishment of a Sugar-Sweetened Beverage Tax

to Support Early Childhood Education

Shall the City of Santa Fe establish a sugar-sweetened beverage tax on distributors in the amount of two cents (\$.02) per fluid ounce, pursuant to Article 10, § 6(D) of the New Mexico Constitution and § 3-18-2(D) NMSA 1978, for the purpose of supporting early childhood education within the geographic boundaries of the Santa Fe Public Schools District?

Section 3. CLOSING OF REGISTRATION BOOKS. Only qualified electors of the City of Santa Fe may vote in the special municipal election. A qualified elector is any person whose affidavit of voter registration has been filed by the Santa Fe County Clerk on or before the twenty-eighth (28th) day prior to the election, who is registered to vote in a general election precinct established by the Santa Fe Board of County Commissioners that is wholly or partly within the City of Santa Fe boundaries, and who is a resident of the City of Santa Fe. Registration books for this election will be closed at 5:00 p.m. on April 4, 2017.

Section 4. VOTING CONVENIENCE CENTERS. All voting precincts within the four (4) city council districts shall be consolidated into Voting Convenience Centers. Any qualified voter within the municipal limits of the City of Santa Fe may vote at any one of the following Voting

15	Section 5. ABSENTEE VOTING. Absentee voting by mail will begin on Tuesday
16	March 28, 2017 and close at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, April 28, 2017. Absentee ballots may be cast in
17	person beginning on Tuesday, March 28, 2017 until 5:00 p.m. on Friday, April 28, 2017. Absentee
18	voting will be conducted in the office of the City Clerk, during the regular hours and days of business
19	Monday through Friday. Applications for absentee ballots may be obtained only from the office of the
20	City Clerk. All applications for absentee ballots must be completed and accepted by the City Clerk
21	prior to 5:00 p.m., Friday, April 28, 2017. After 5:00 p.m. on April 28, 2017, all unused absented
22	ballots will be publicly destroyed by the City Clerk. The City Clerk will accept completed absentee
23	ballots delivered by mail, or in person by the voter casting the absentee ballot, their caregiver or the
24	voter's immediate family, until 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 2, 2017.

12	Section 7. BALLOTS. The casting of votes by qualified municipal electors shall be
13	recorded on paper ballots to be counted by Image Cast Evolution electronic vote tabulators.
14	Section 8. CANVASS OF THE ELECTION RESULTS. The City Clerk shall
15	complete the canvass of the election results no later than 5:00 p.m. on May 5, 2017, to certify the
16	results of the election and take any other necessary action relating to the election.
