10	A RESOLUTION
11	PROCLAIMING SEVERE OR EXTREME DROUGHT CONDITIONS MAY EXIST IN
12	THE CITY OF SANTA FE; IMPOSING FIRE RESTRICTIONS; RESTRICTING THE
13	SALE OR USE OF FIREWORKS WITHIN THE CITY OF SANTA FE AND
14	PROHIBITING OTHER FIRE HAZARD ACTIVITIES.
15	
16	WHEREAS, the danger of range fires, grass fires, forest fires and structure fires is very
17	high or extremely high in and around the city of Santa Fe; and
18	WHEREAS, the weather in Santa Fe has been dry and windy, contributing to the present
19	very high or extremely high fire risk, and it is predicted that the windy and dry weather will
20	continue into the coming weeks, causing progressively worsening fire conditions; and
21	WHEREAS, due to abnormally low winter precipitation, United States forest service
22	data indicates very high or extreme fire danger presently exists; and
23	WHEREAS, it is anticipated that drought conditions will be present for the foreseeable
24	future; and
25	WHEREAS, the probability of ignition of materials likely to serve as fuel for fire is

presently extremely high in the city of Santa Fe; and

WHEREAS, if the city experiences a fire that burns out of control in the watershed, 40% of the city's water resources are at serious risk of complete loss or substantially reduced capacity; and

WHEREAS, if the city experiences a fire that burns out of control in populated areas, it may be necessary to evacuate and relocate affected residents; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.M. Stat. Ann. Section 60-2C-8.1, the governing body of a municipality is authorized to restrict the sale or use of fireworks within the boundaries of the municipality if severe or extreme drought conditions exist.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE:

12 This resolution shall be deemed a proclamation within the meaning of Section 1. 13 Section 60-2C-8.1 NMSA 1978 and Section 12-3.9 SFCC 1987.

14 As per Section 60-2C-8.1 NMSA 1978, the Governing Body anticipates Section 2. 15 severe or extreme drought conditions may exist within the boundaries of the city of Santa Fe 16 based upon current drought indices published by the national weather service and other relevant 17 information supplied by the United States forest service.

18 Section 3. The governing body restricts the sale or use of fireworks to the maximum 19 extent possible permitted in Section 60-2C-8.1 NMSA 1978.

20 A. within the city limits:

The sale or use of the following fireworks is specifically prohibited

(1) aerial devices:

> (a) aerial spinners;

- (b) helicopters;
 - mines; (c)

10	Section 4.	An exe	ception to the above restrictions are public displays of fireworks in		
11	strict conformance with the requirements and conditions set forth in Section 12-3.3 SFCC 1987				
12	and as approved by the City of Santa Fe fire chief.				
13	Section 5.	Pursua	nt to Section 12-3.9 SFCC 1987:		
14	А.	A. Any individual, firm, partnership or other entity found in violation of the			
15	above restrictions shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by				
16	imprisonment for up to ninety (90) days or a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars				
17	(\$500), or both.				
18	В.	Each	and every occasion on which this section is violated shall be		
19	considered a separate offense.				
20	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that:				
21	Section 1.	Due t	o severe or extreme drought conditions and wildland fire		
22	conditions, the Governing Body hereby prohibits the following activities, in accordance with the				
23	International Fire Code® as adopted by §12-2.1 SFCC 1987:				
24	А.	Open l	ourning, including campfires, bonfires, pit barbecues;		
25	В.	Burnir	g of weeds, trash, or other vegetation;

C. Using charcoal barbecue grills in public parks and recreation areas;

D. Smoking in public parks, recreation areas, or on any public trail; and

E. Using any motorized all terrain vehicle or motorcycles on city owned open space, parks, trails, or other recreational areas, except for the Motocross Track located off of the 599 Relief Route.

6 Charcoal barbecuing at a residential structure is permitted if the fire is closely monitored and fire7 extinguishing equipment, such as a garden hose or fire extinguisher, is readily available.

Section 2. Pursuant to Section 1-3.1 SFCC 1987:

A. Any individual, firm, partnership or other entity found in violation of the above restrictions shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by imprisonment for up to ninety (90) days or a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500), or both.

B. Each and every occasion on which this section is violated shall be considered a separate offense.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body recognizes that Section 60 2C-8.1 NMSA 1978 only allows municipalities to adopt fire restrictions for 30 days at a time and
no less than 20 days prior to a holiday for which fireworks may be sold. Therefore, the
Governing Body imposes the restrictions effective immediately to ensure that such fire
restrictions are in place during extreme or severe drought conditions and wildland fire conditions.
