11	SUPPORTING THE EIGHTH ANNUAL NEIGHBOR TO NEIGHBOR FOOD DRIVE	
12	AND AUTHORIZING THE USE OF CITY VEHICLES AND STAFF TO ASSIST WITH	
13	COLLECTION OF THE DONATIONS.

15	WHEREAS, according to Feeding Americ	can's "Map the Meal Gap", New Mexico
16	consistently ranks as one of the worst states for food security; and	
17	WHEREAS, in New Mexico, more than 320	0,000 people seek food assistance annually;
18	and	
19	WHEREAS, over 18,300 people live in po	verty in Santa Fe County, with over 5,900
20	children in poverty; and	
21	WHEREAS, in Santa Fe County, one in four	children are affected by hunger; and
22	WHEREAS, research has demonstrated chil	dren who go without adequate healthy food
23	cannot thrive nor learn well; and	
24	WHEREAS, public and private partnerships	can both feed children and improve the local
25	agricultural economy; and

WHEREAS, within the City, nearly 10% of low-income families live a mile or more from the nearest grocery store; and

WHEREAS, in Northern New Mexico, it is the mission of The Food Depot to end hunger in this area; and

WHEREAS, The Food Depot fulfills this goal through serving as the food bank for nine Northern New Mexico counties, providing food to more than 145 nonprofit agencies, including emergency food pantries, hot meal programs, homeless shelters, youth programs, senior centers, homes for the mentally disabled, and shelters for battered persons; and

WHEREAS, in 2018 The Food Depot distributed an average of 510,000 pounds of food each month, providing more than 425,000 meals to people in need, including the most vulnerable in our community; and

WHEREAS, more than just feeding people, The Food Depot is trying to help people change their lives; and

WHEREAS, every September since 2012, the neighborhoods in the Santa Fe area have participated in donating food to The Food Depot through an area-wide neighborhood association "Neighbor to Neighbor" Food Drive, in conjunction with the national "Hunger Action Month"; and

WHEREAS, this food drive has grown exponentially over the last seven years; and

WHEREAS, in 2017, 87 neighborhoods donated, in combination of pounds of food and monetary donations, a grand total of over 76 tons, or 152,297 pounds of food to the drive, thereby providing 126,914 meals for those in need; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, over 100 neighborhoods and businesses donated, in combination of pounds of food and monetary donations, a grand total of over 100 tons or 240,000 pounds of food to this drive, therefore providing over 200,000 meals for those in need; and

WHEREAS, the meals provided in 2018 to those in need are equivalent to nearly half of

2	Neighbor Food Drive to accomplishing the mission of the organization; and
3	WHEREAS, on Saturday, September 21, 2019, the neighborhood associations and
4	communities of the Santa Fe area will again band together for the Eighth Annual Area-Wide
5	"Neighbor to Neighbor Food Drive"; and
6	WHEREAS, the success of this program over the preceding seven years is evidence that
7	the food drive will continue to be an annual event that neighborhood associations across the city
8	look forward to participating in each year, with the encouragement and support of the City and its
9	elected officials.
10	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF
11	THE CITY OF SANTA FE that it supports and encourages the efforts of the eighth annual
12	"Neighbor to Neighbor Food Drive" on September 21, 2019.
13	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Councilors and appropriate staff, as
14	determined by the City Manager, in conjunction with organizers of the "Neighbor to Neighbor Food
15	Drive", are requested to help inform all neighborhoods in Santa Fe of the food drive and to assist
16	the neighborhoods and The Food Depot in collecting the food donations that are donated through
17	this drive, providing trucks and personnel, as well as working cooperatively with Santa Fe County,
18	so that we may all "Stand Together" to help stop hunger in our northern New Mexico communities.
