10	A RESOLUTION
11	URGING THE NEW MEXICO STATE LEGISLATURE TO REPEAL THE STATE TAX
12	ON SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS FOR NEW MEXICO SENIORS.

14	WHEREAS, in 1990 the New Mexico Legislature passed Senate Bill 310, which
15	expanded New Mexico's definition of "modified gross income" to include Social Security
16	benefits, causing them to be considered taxable income by the State of New Mexico; and
17	WHEREAS, this legislation continues to harm Santa Fe's and New Mexico's seniors
18	who rely on Social Security income to survive; and
19	WHEREAS, taxing Social Security benefits is a form of double taxation because when it
20	is deducted from paychecks it is subject to state and federal taxes; and
21	WHEREAS, New Mexico is one of only thirteen states that levies an income tax on
22	Social Security payments to some beneficiaries and has the second highest tax on Social Security
23	benefits in the nation; and
24	WHEREAS, those residents of Santa Fe receiving Social Security benefits are seniors
25	that, in many cases, have contributed greatly to the community thorough volunteer work and

advocacy; and
WHEREAS, many residents receiving Social Security benefits are experiencing poverty
and would benefit greatly from the additional funds available by not taxing these benefits; and
WHEREAS, Santa Fe is an age-friendly city, a community that honors and respects the
contributions of seniors to society; and
WHEREAS, Santa Fe wishes to encourage people of all ages to move to Santa Fe, and
New Mexico more broadly, and repealing this tax would add to the attraction the City and State
already offer; and
WHEREAS, the tax on Social Security benefits disproportionately impacts fixed income
residents - those residents of Santa Fe who need those benefits the most; and
WHEREAS, recipients of Social Security benefits worked their careers with the promise
and expectation that their needs in retirement would be at least partially provided for by Social
Security; and
WHEREAS, taxing Social Security benefits undermines the purpose of the Social
Security Act, which was designed to lift seniors out of poverty, not to fund State government; and
WHEREAS, ensuring more money remains in the pockets of the City's residents is
expected to result in less need for government support of lower-income seniors and additional
taxes from increased consumer spending that will provide enhanced benefits for all residents.
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE
CITY OF SANTA FE urges the New Mexico State Legislature to enact legislation repealing the
State tax on Social Security benefits that has created an undue burden on New Mexico's seniors
since its enactment in 1990.
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk is directed to transmit a copy of this
Resolution to Santa Fe Legislative Delegation.
