11	PERMITTING CITY DEPARTMENTS TO SEEK RETROACTIVE APPROVAL OF
12	CONTRACTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021 FOR UP TO NINETY (90) DAYS
13	
14	WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has caused unforeseeable disruption globally and
15	locally in the City of Santa Fe; and
16	WHEREAS, one of the consequences of this disruption has been that the City's
17	revenues, expenditures, and budget are uncertain and the State of New Mexico has postponed the
18	requirement for submitting an approved budget to the State; and
19	WHEREAS, City Departments' budgets have been uncertain, while contracts have
20	expired with the typical end of fiscal year; and
21	WHEREAS, if certain contracts expire without renewal, the delay of renewal will cause
22	further delays to the provision of services throughout the City, and the City would require
23	additional time to solicit and negotiate replacement contracts; and
24	WHEREAS, the purchasing manual allows for the retroactive approval of contracts for
25	up to thirty (30) days after their expiration date and longer if exceptional circumstances apply that

WHEREAS, state law permits emergency procurement "when the service, construction or item of tangible personal property procured is needed immediately to control a serious threat to public health, welfare, safety or property caused by a flood, fire, epidemic, riot, act of terrorism, equipment failure or similar event; or plan or prepare for the response to a serious threat to public health, welfare, safety or property caused by a flood, fire, epidemic, riot, act of terrorism, equipment failure or similar event and cannot be acquired through normal procurement methods." NMSA 1978, § 13-1-127; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic has created an ongoing disruptive, deadly, and costly exceptional circumstance—that necessitates retroactive approval of contracts and amendments that would have otherwise expired at the beginning of Fiscal Year 2021, for up to ninety (90) days beyond the date they would otherwise expire.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that Departments may bring contracts to be amended or extended for up to ninety (90) days after the end of the contract term, if the renewal has been delayed by the COVID-19 pandemic for Fiscal Year 2021.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in no event shall contracts as extended or amended exceed the terms allowed by NMSA 1978, Sections 13-1-150 to -152.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Finance Department shall track the number of contracts retroactively approved during the COVID-19 pandemic and report the number to the Finance Committee on a periodic basis during the pendency of the pandemic.
