WHEREAS, the Food Depot fulfills this goal through serving as the food bank for nine Northern New Mexico counties, providing food to more than 145 nonprofit agencies, including emergency food pantries, hot meal programs, homeless shelters, youth programs, senior centers, homes for the mentally disabled, and shelters for battered persons; and

WHEREAS, in 2019, the Food Depot distributed an average of 527,000 pounds of food each month, providing more than 439,000 meals to people in need, including the most vulnerable in our community; and

WHEREAS, more than just feeding people, The Food Depot is trying to help people change their lives; and

WHEREAS, every September since 2012, the neighborhoods in the Santa Fe area have participated in donating food to The Food Depot through an area-wide neighborhood association "Neighbor to Neighbor" Food Drive, in conjunction with the national "Hunger Action Month"; and

WHEREAS, this food drive has grown exponentially over the last eight years; and

WHEREAS, in 2017, 87 neighborhoods donated, in combination of pounds of food and monetary donations, a grand total of over 76 tons, or 152,297 pounds of food to the drive, thereby providing 126,914 meals for those in need; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, over 100 neighborhoods and businesses donated, in combination of pounds of food and monetary donations, a grand total of over 100 tons or 240,000 pounds of food to this drive, therefore providing over 200,000 meals for those in need; and

WHEREAS, the meals provided in 2018 to those in need are equivalent to nearly half of one month's distribution from The Food Depot, illustrating the importance of the Neighbor to Neighbor Food Drive to accomplishing the mission of the organization; and

WHEREAS, in 2019, the Santa Fe community provided 364,290 pounds of food, equal to 303,575 meals for those in need; and

WHEREAS, the onset of the novel coronavirus pandemic has restricted the ability of the

2	WHEREAS, instead, the Food Depot will accept monetary donations in order to purchase
3	food that will be distributed to needy families in northern New Mexico; and
4	WHEREAS, on Saturday, September 19, 2020, the neighborhood associations and
5	communities of the Santa Fe area will again band together for the Ninth Annual Area-Wide
6	"Neighbor to Neighbor Fund Drive" to benefit The Food Depot.
7	WHEREAS, the success of this program over the preceding eight years is evidence that
8	the food drive will continue to be an annual event that neighborhood associations across the city
9	look forward to participating in each year, with the encouragement and support of the City and its
10	elected officials.
11	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF
12	THE CITY OF SANTA FE that it supports and encourages the efforts of the eighth annual
13	"Neighbor to Neighbor Fund Drive" on September 19, 2020.
