21	Section 1. Section 16-9.3 of SFCC 1987 (being Ord. No. 2016-43 § 2, as amended)

23	6-19.3 Membership; terms; vacancies.		
24	A. Membership. The commission shall be comprised of seven (7) members, all of		
25	whom must reside within the municipal boundaries of the city of Santa Fe. [The mayor shall		

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appoint, with the advice	e and consent of the governing body,] The ethics and campaign review board
shall appoint the mem	abers of the commission. The commission shall consist of one (1) member
from each of the follow	wing categories:
(1)	One (1) shall be a member of the Santa Fe chamber of commerce.
(2)	One (1) shall be a representative of a neighborhood association.
(3)	One (1) shall be a representative of a community organization.
(4)	One (1) shall be a current or retired attorney or judge.
(5)	One (1) shall be a representative of the human resources industry, or an
employment c	onsultant.
(6)	One (1) shall be a current or retired chief executive officer.
(7)	One (1) member shall be appointed at-large.
Nomi	nees to the commission shall have the ability to exercise sound and practical
judgement in t	he implementation of their powers and duties as members of the commission.
[The mayor sl	nall appoint] Members of the commission shall appoint a chairperson [prior
to the] at the	first meeting of the commission. The chairperson shall then appoint a vice-
chairperson at	the first regular meeting.
B. Term	s. Members of the commission shall serve four (4) year terms. A member
shall serve for no mo	ore than two (2) terms. After two (2) consecutive unexcused absences, a
commission member	shall be automatically removed from the commission, and a new member
shall be appointed con	sistent with the provisions of paragraph A.
C. Vacar	ncies. Vacancies on the commission shall be filled consistent with the
provisions of paragrap	h A.
Section 2.	Section 6-16.2 of SFCC 1987 (being Ord. No. 2005-14, as amended) is
amended to read:	
6-16.2 Powers and d	luties.

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A.	The board shall enforce the provisions of the Code of Ethics (Section 1-7 SFCC
1987), the C	Campaign Code (Section 9-2 SFCC 1987) and the Public Campaign Finance Code
(Section 9-3	SFCC 1987) in accordance with the procedures prescribed in this section and such
rules as the b	poard may adopt.

- B. The board shall establish reasonable rules of practice and procedure which are not in conflict with the provisions of city code or other city rules of practice and procedure, timetables and explanatory materials designed to educate the public, to encourage voluntary compliance and to ensure fair and prompt disposition of alleged violations. All such rules of practice and procedure shall be available to the public in the city clerk's office and on the city's website.
- C. The board may give advisory opinions to any person requesting an opinion as to whether his or her own future conduct would violate the Code of Ethics, the Campaign Code or the Public Campaign Finance Code. An advisory opinion rendered by the board shall be binding on the board in any subsequent proceeding on a complaint against the person or entity who requested the opinion and acted in good faith in reliance thereon, unless the person or entity omitted or misstated a material fact in requesting the advisory opinion. Advisory opinions shall be indexed and maintained on file with the city clerk and placed on the city's web site.
- D. In the exercise of its responsibilities, the board may audit campaign or other records. After each election campaign the board may contract for professional reviews or audits of campaign finance statements and shall file their results with the city clerk's office.
- E. The board shall periodically review and recommend changes to the governing body for improving the Code of Ethics, the Election Code, the Campaign Code, or the Public Campaign Finance Code, particularly following a municipal election.
- F. [Reserved] The board shall appoint the members of the independent salary commission pursuant to Section 6-19.3, SFCC 1987.

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H. The board shall review and make recommendations to the governing body		
regarding the governing body procedural rules and other procedural matters including, but not		
limited to, the city's annual open meetings act compliance resolution.
