11	URGING THE NEW MEXICO PUBLIC REGULATION COMMISSION TO FIND THAT
12	THIRD PARTY DEVELOPERS UTILIZING SOLAR POWER SERVICE
13	AGREEMENTS ARE NOT PUBLIC UTILITIES AND NOT SUBJECT TO
14	REGULATION BY THE PRC THEREBY ELIMINATING MARKET UNCERTAINTY
15	FOR RENEWABLE ENERGY.

17	WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe has taken various steps to encourage and support
18	energy conservation and sustainability in the community; and
19	WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe recognizes the importance of renewable energy as an
20	economic initiative as well as crucial to the environment; and
21	WHEREAS, the Governing Body endorsed the U.S. Conference of Mayors Climate
22	Protection Agreement (Resolution No. 2006-54); and
23	WHEREAS, the Governing Body adopted high performance energy efficient standards
24	for city buildings (Resolution No. 2006-55); and
25	WHEREAS the Governing Rody approved the Sustainable Santa Fe Plan promoting the

WHEREAS, the Governing Body supports the use of renewable energy at city facilities and has directed staff to contract with qualified vendors to provide renewable energy (Resolution No. 2008-46); and

WHEREAS, in today's credit market, solar power service agreements provide an ideal way to overcome the high up-front capital costs of a solar system, and are the preferred means of financing solar installations, particularly for government entities; and

WHEREAS, government entities are not able to take advantage of federal and state solar tax credits and therefore virtually all large scale photovoltaic systems at government facilities in Colorado, California, New Jersey, and Oregon use solar power service agreements to accomplish renewable energy goals; and

WHEREAS, the City of Santa Fe is actively engaged in solar power service agreements for the purchase of renewable energy; and

WHEREAS, the possibility that these agreements will be regulated as public utilities has seriously and negatively affected the City of Santa Fe's ability to move forward with expanding use of solar energy in New Mexico.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that the Governing Body urges the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission to find that third party developers utilizing solar power service agreements are not public utilities and not subject to regulation by the PRC thereby eliminating market uncertainty for renewable energy.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that City staff is directed to forward this Resolution to the New Mexico Public Regulation Commission.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that City staff is directed to file a motion to intervene in the matter of a declaratory order regarding third party arrangements for renewable
