5	AN ORDINANCE
6	AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF THE SANTA FE SMOKE FREE ORDINANCE,
7	ARTICLE 10-6 SFCC 1987 FOR CLARIFICATION OF ISSUES THAT HAVE ARISEN
8	DURING THE ENFORCEMENT OF THE SANTA FE SMOKE FREE ORDINANCE.
9	
10	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE:
11	Section 1. Section 10-6.3 SFCC 1987 (being Ord. No. 1999-47, as amended) is
12	amended to amend the following definitions:
13	Bar means an establishment that is devoted to the serving of alcoholic beverages for
14	consumption by guests on the premises and in which the serving of food generates fifteen percent
15	(15%) or less of the total gross annual income of the bar in any calendar year. Bars include, but
16	are not limited to, taverns, nightclubs, cocktail lounges, and cabarets. "Bar" does not include the
17	dining areas of a restaurant, regardless of whether alcoholic beverages are served therein.
18	Cigar bar means an establishment that:
19	A. Is a bar, as defined in this section, except that it serves only complementary
20	snacks; and
21	B. Is engaged in the business of selling cigars for consumption by patrons on the
22	premises and generates ten percent or more of its total annual gross revenue or at least ten
23	thousand dollars (\$10,000) in annual sales from the sale of cigars, not including any sales from
24	vending machines. A cigar bar that fails to generate at least ten percent of its total annual sales
25	from the sale of cigars in the calendar year after December 31, 2006, not including sales from

1	vending machin	nes, shall not be defined as a cigar bar and shall not thereafter be known as such
2	regardless of sa	les figures. A cigar bar shall agree to provide adequate information to demonstrate
3	to the city's sati	sfaction compliance with this definition.
4	Section	2. Section 10-6.5 SFCC 1987 (being Ord. No. 1999-47, as amended) is

6	10-6.5	Smoking Prohibited in Public Places. Smoking shall be prohibited in all
7	enclosed public	places within the city of Santa Fe including, but not limited to, the following

24	K.	Any facility which is primarily used for exhibiting any motion picture, stage

7	public meeting is in progress, to the extent such place is subject to the jurisdiction of the city.
