10	A RESOLUTION
11	REPEALING RESOLUTION NO. 2009-31; AND DIRECTING STAFF TO PREPARE
12	THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTS TO COMPLETE THE DONATION OF 5.7 ACRES
13	OF VACANT CITY OWNED LAND LOCATED ADJACENT TO THE SANTA FE
14	NATIONAL CEMETERY TO THE NATIONAL CEMETERY ADMINISTRATION,
15	DEPARTMENT OF VETERAN'S AFFAIRS.

17	WHEREAS, on February 25, 2009, the Governing Body adopted Resolution No. 2009-
18	31 directing staff to prepare the necessary documents to complete the donation of approximately
19	five acres of vacant city owned land located adjacent to the Santa Fe National Cemetery to the
20	National Cemetery Administration, Department of Veterans Affairs; and
21	WHEREAS, Resolution No. 2009-31 excluded from the donation approximately 0.7
22	acres of the city's parcel that includes the ridgeline which serves as a sound barrier to U.S.
23	Highway 285 for adjacent residential areas as well as an existing trail; and
24	WHEREAS, excluding the 0.7 acres does not meet the Department of Veterans Affairs
25	long term needs for possible expansion to the south onto undeveloped land of the St. Catherine's

Indian School; and

WHEREAS, keeping the trail along the southern edge of what would be the National Cemetery's boundary and having the ridgeline trail intruding between two sections of the cemetery would encourage dog walking and recreational activities that are incompatible with the cemetery and prohibited by federal regulations; and

WHEREAS, the National Cemetery is unable to accept the city's offer to donate the five acres; however, the National Cemetery has indicated its continued interest in the city's donation of the full 5.7 acres; and

WHEREAS, Section 3-54-2(D) NMSA 1978 provides in part that "[a] municipality may...sell or ...donate real...property to...the federal government if such...gift is in the best interests of the public and is approved by the local government division of the department of finance and administration".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that:

- 1. Resolution No. 2009-31 is repealed.
- 2. The city agrees to donate 5.7 acres adjacent to the Santa Fe National Cemetery to the National Cemetery Administration, Department of Veterans Affairs, with the understanding that the National Cemetery will work with the city to preserve the topography of the ridgeline as much as possible when designing the cemetery expansion.
- 3. Staff is directed to prepare the necessary documents to complete the donation including, but not limited to, rescinding the prior quitclaim deed, consolidating the 0.7 acre parcel with the five acre parcel, and preparing a new deed acceptable to the City Attorney and the Department of Veterans Affairs.
