# CITY OF SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO 1 **ORDINANCE NO. 2011-22** 2 3 4 AN ORDINANCE 5 AMENDING RULE 8 OF EXHIBIT A, CHAPTER 22 SFCC 1987, TO REPEAL THE 4.7 6 PERCENT PER YEAR SEWER RATE INCREASES FOR MONTHLY SEWER 7 SERVICE AND USAGE FEES THAT WERE TO BE EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2012, 8 OCTOBER 1, 2013 AND OCTOBER 1, 2014; AND AMENDING RULE 12, OF EXHIBIT 9 A OF CHAPTER 22 SFCC 1987 TO REPEAL THE 4.7 PERCENT PER YEAR 10 INCREASES IN THE MASS BASED COST OF PROVIDING AIR TO REMOVE THE 11 CHEMICAL OXYGEN DEMAND IN WASTEWATER THAT WERE TO BE 12 EFFECTIVE OCTOBER 1, 2012, OCTOBER 1, 2013 AND OCTOBER 1, 2014. 13 14 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE: 15 Rule 8 of Exhibit A of Chapter 22 SFCC 1987 (being Ord. #1997-3, Section 1. 16 Exhibit A, as amended) is amended to read: 17 Sewer Service Charges. 18 8. 19 A. Connected to City Sewer Single Family Residential Sewer Service Fees and Usage Fees. 1. 20 Single family residential sewer service fees and usage fees shall apply if 21 a sewer customer is served by city water and meets the single family 22 service classification for water as set forth in Chapter 25 SFCC 1987. If 23 not served by city water, single family residential sewer service fees and 24 usage fees shall apply where the sewer connection serves only one unit\*

# 2. Multi-Family Residential Sewer Service:

The following sewer service fees and usage fees shall apply if a sewer customer is served by city water and meets the multi-family residential service classification for water as set forth in Chapter 25 SFCC 1987. If not served by city water, multi-family residential sewer service fees and usage fees shall apply where the sewer connection serves more than one unit\* for normal domestic sewage.

# 4. Exceptions to Commercial Sewer Service.

Mobile home parks; commercial greenhouses; churches; properties owned by the U.S. government, the state of New Mexico, the city of Santa Fe, the county of Santa Fe and the Santa Fe board of education; and state accredited private elementary and secondary schools and

colleges shall not be considered commercial sewer services and shall be considered residential sewer service.

### C. Taxes.

Billings under the this schedule may be increased by an amount equal to the sum of taxes payable under the Gross Receipts and Compensating Tax Act and of all other taxes, fees, or charges payable by the City and levied or assessed by any governmental authority on the public utility service rendered, or on the right or privilege of rendering the service, or on any object or event incidental to the rendition of the service.

#### **Notes:**

#### \* Unit means:

- For residential customers: one room, or rooms connected together, constituting a separate, independent housekeeping establishment for owner occupancy, or rental or lease and physically separated from any other rooms or residential units that may be in the same structure and containing independent plumbing facilities. A residential unit may include, but is not limited to, a single family house, an apartment unit, condominium unit, mobile home, or a guest house.
- For commercial customers: an area constituting a separate, independent enterprise establishment for owner occupancy, or rental or lease and physically
