11	PROCLAIMING A PUBLIC SAFETY SUMMER, RECOGNIZING THE CITY OF SANTA		
12	FE POLICE DEPARTMENT'S OPERATION "FULL COURT PRESS" AND REACHING		
13	OUT TO NORTHERN NEW MEXICO COMMUNITIES TO COLLABORATE, EXPLORE		
14	AND RECOMMEND SOLUTIONS TO ADDICTIONS THAT LEAD TO CRIMINAL		
15	ACTIVITY BY ESTABLISHING LAW ENFORCEMENT ASSISTED DIVERSION		
16	("LEAD") TASK FORCE.

18	WHEREAS, in 2010, the city of Santa Fe experienced the highest number of documented		
19	incidents for property crime; and		
20	WHEREAS, in 2011, the property crime incidents were greatly reduced due to a multi-		
21	faceted approach by the Santa Fe Police Department; and		
22 ·	WHEREAS, in 2012, the incidents of property crimes are on the rise, and in an effort to		
23	combat another high year of property crimes, on June 9, 2012 the Police Department launched		
24	Operation "Full Court Press"; and		
25	WHEREAS, the ultimate goal of Operation Full Court Press is to reduce the property crime		

numbers by taking a multifaceted approach to the problem by assigning the entire Police Department to collectively approach the problems associated with property crimes; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body recognizes that the City cannot arrest its way out of the high incidence of property crimes, understands that the underlying problems related to property crimes are associated with persons who are addicted to drugs and alcohol and is intent on breaking the cycle of drug use, crime, delinquency and incarceration; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to explore and discuss options for removing drug traffickers from the streets, which should curb the escalating drug addiction problems; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to explore and discuss multidisciplinary approaches to treating addictions that lead to criminal activity, a need to increase the availability of pre- and post-incarceration treatment resources and a need to increase recovery support services; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body desires to invite representatives from local governmental entities, state agencies, law enforcement agencies, the judiciary, service providers and representatives from Northern New Mexico communities to participate in a regional summit to join the City of Santa Fe's efforts to explore and recommend solutions for combating the underlying addiction problems related to property crimes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that the Governing Body hereby proclaims the Summer of 2012 a "Public Safety Summer", and recognizes and applauds the City Police Department's efforts to combat property crime by establishing Operation Full Court Press.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body acknowledges that addictions are too often the underlying problem related to criminal activity, therefore, the Governing Body hereby establishes a Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion ("LEAD") Task Force.

Section 1. NAME: The task force shall be called the Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion Task Force ("LEAD Task Force").

1	H. Any other related issues that may be identified by the LEAD Task Force.			
2	Section 4. MEMBERSHIP; OFFICERS; TERM:			
3	A. The Mayor will appoint the members of the Task Force, with the approval by the			
4	City Council.			
5	B. The LEAD Task Force will be comprised of representatives from the City of Santa			
6	Fe, Santa Fe County, Los Alamos County, Rio Arriba County, the City of Espanola, Santa Fe Cour			
7	Sheriff's Office, Rio Arriba County Sheriff's Office, the District Attorney's Office, the Public			
8	Defender's Office, local area schools, a local area medical center, the Magistrate Court and the			
9	District Court, local service providers, including youth organizations, drug and alcohol treatment			
10	centers, individuals with expertise and research experience in the field of addictions, and any other			
11	stakeholders that may be determined by the Governing Body or the LEAD Task Force.			
12	C. The Mayor will appoint the chairperson. The chairperson shall appoint a vice-chair			
13	person.			
14	D. The members shall serve until they complete their duties and responsibilities as set			
15	forth above.			
16	E. Members shall serve without compensation			
17	Section 5. VACANCIES: Vacancies on the LEAD Task Force shall be filled in the			
18	same manner as initial appointments.			
19	Section 6. MEETINGS; DURATION: The LEAD Task Force shall conduct an initial			
20	summit with the membership and before the public and, at least once per month thereafter and shall			
21	conduct public meetings in accordance with the Open Meetings Act and adopted city policy and			
22	procedures. Unless further extended by the Governing Body, LEAD Task Force meetings shall			
23	conclude no more than 6 months from the date of passage of this resolution.			
24	Section 7. STAFF LIAISON: Community Services department staff shall serve as the			
25	liaison to the Task Force.
