October 11, 2012

1. CALL TO ORDER

A regular meeting of the City of Santa Fe Capital Improvements Advisory Committee was called to order by Karen Walker, Chair at 3:00 p.m. on this date in the City Councilors' Conference Room, 1st Floor, City Hall, Santa Fe, New Mexico.

2. ROLL CALL

Roll call indicated a quorum was present for conducting official business as follows:

3. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Ms. Pope moved to approve the Agenda. Ms. Veneklasen seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Meeting of September 13, 2012

The following changes were offered to the Minutes of the September 13, 2012 meeting;

Page 6, 1st paragraph was changed to read: "Mr. Liming said this will probably come out of the Roads Fund and there is about \$2 million in the Roads Fund; about \$180,000 in the Parks Fund and about \$30,000 in each Fire and Police Funds."

Page 6, 3rd paragraph was changed to read: "Chair Walker said no, it would have to be a capacity and enhancing project."

Ms. Pope moved to approve the Minutes of the September 13, 2012 meeting as amended. Ms. Veneklasen seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

5. DISCUSSION AND ACTION ITEMS

In January 2012, the City started "waiving" impact fees on permits for all new housing units. Mr. Liming said from January 1, 2012 through September 30, 2012, the City has collected a total of \$214,319 in impact fee revenue and has waived a total of \$848,190 in residential impact fees. The following residential units have had impact fees waived:

- 98 Single family units
- 176 Multi-family units (San Isidro Apt. Complex)
- 7 Guest House units
- 6 Residential Studios/Other units

Totals: 287 Housing Units

Mr. Lucero feels that the waiving of residential impact fees is having a big impact on the bottom line for the City. He explained that the City of Albuquerque is struggling

with their impact fees because of the way the tiers for impact fees were structured; and presently they are trying to balance this, and it is having an impact on their bottom line.

Ms. Pope noted that the Committee recommended to City Council that they waive the residential impact fees for one year only.

Mr. Martinez asked how many of the single family units were built by Centex.

Mr. Liming said he did not have that information today but offered to research it.

The Board discussed the proposed pro-union ordinance that went into effect this month and the potential economic impacts of the rules on the local community. Mr. Martinez noted that Councilor Patti Bushee introduced an emergency resolution Wednesday night to halt implementation of the "Community Workforce Agreement" ordinance, which calls for the contractors on big city jobs to agree to use mostly union labor.

6. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

A. Quarterly Financial Summary & Permit Report (July-September 2012) [Copies of the Quarterly Financial Summary and Permit Report {Exhibit 6A} were distributed in the Members' packets.]

Mr. Liming reviewed Exhibit 6A noting that the City brought in \$70,222.00 in impact fees for the first quarter of the fiscal year.

Mr. Liming said state law requires a 60-day public comment period for the Resolution that indicates that the City has made a determination that no update of land use assumptions, Capital Improvements Plan or Impact Fees is needed at this time. Last night, City Council approved to publish the notice in the newspaper. The Public Hearing is scheduled for January 9th, 2013.
