

What the Zoning Abbreviations mean:

Residential:

R indicates it is a residential zone:

The number indicates the number of residential units per acre.

R-1, R-2, R-3, R-4, R-5, R-6, R-7, R-8, R-9, R-10, R-12, R-21, and R-29

Other residential zones are:

RR Rural Residential

RAC Residential Arts and Crafts

RC-5 and RC-8 Residential Compound Districts

R-7(I) Single-Family Residential Infill District

Non-Residential (commercial)

The letter code indicates the type of district (commercial, industrial, etc.), while the number specifies the business types within the district.

C-1 Office and Related Commercial District

C-2 General Commercial District

C-4 Limited Office, Retail and Arts and Crafts District

HZ Hospital Zone District

I-1 Light Industrial District

I-2 General Industrial District

BIP Business and Industrial Park District

PRC Planned Residential Community District
