DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE NEW MEXICO ENERGY, MINERALS AND NATURAL RESOURCES DEPARTMENT (EMNRD), ENERGY CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT DIVISION AND THE CITY OF SANTA FE, WHOSE PURPOSE IS TO PROVIDE THE CITY ACCESS TO SERVICES AND SUPPORT PROVIDED UNDER EMNRD'S LOCAL ENERGY EFFICIENCY PERFORMANCE (LEEP) PROGRAM FOR DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF GUARANTEED ENERGY SERVICE PERFORMANCE CONTRACTS.

WHEREAS, the State of New Mexico, Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department (EMNRD), Energy Conservation and Management Division (Division) is responsible pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 9-5A-4 for planning, administering, reviewing, providing technical assistance, maintaining records and monitoring state and federal energy conservation and renewable energy technology programs; and

WHEREAS, the Division is responsible for certification that qualified providers of energy

conservation measures pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 6-23-5B(2), to meet experience requirements and the guaranteed energy savings from the energy conservation and renewable energy measures proposed in guaranteed utility savings contracts with governmental units appear to be accurately estimated and reasonable; and

WHEREAS, few local governments have the tools, technical knowledge, and financing to pursue energy efficiency and renewable energy projects; and

WHEREAS, the US Department of Energy (DOE) has entered into a cooperative agreement with EMNRD to implement a Local Energy Efficiency Performance (LEEP) Program to fill these technical and financial gaps by creating a sustainable state-led program to support successful implementation of energy service performance contracts (ESPCs) throughout all local government facilities in New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, this MOA's purpose is to provide the City access to the services and support provided under the LEEP Program for development and implementation of guaranteed ESPCs and to help the City follow and adhere to the guidelines of the Program; and

WHEREAS, EMNRD and the City desire to enter into this MOA for administrative efficiency so that the project can be carried out through a single program; and

WHEREAS, the Division seeks to use its experience to support implementation of ESPCs throughout local government facilities in New Mexico; apply lessons learned to continually improve the LEEP Program; reduce facility energy use and carbon emissions; and ensure proper level of financing accompanies each Project identified by the Program; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body, through the adoption of Resolution 2014-85, the Governing Body declared its intention of having 50 percent of its energy come from renewable sources by 2025 and becoming carbon neutral by the year 2040.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE that the City Manager is directed to enter into the Memorandum of

An ESPC could also help to reduce carbon emissions in the community through the reduced consumption of fossil fuel-based electricity, create local jobs, and improve the indoor environments of public buildings utilized by the public and City employees.
