Ives 6 7 8 9 10 A RESOLUTION 11 AUTHORIZING THE SALE AND CONSUMPTION OF BEER DURING THE PARTY 12 ON THE PITCH SOCCER TOURNAMENT ON JUNE 2-3, 2018, PURSUANT TO 13 SECTION 23-6.2(B) SFCC 1987. 14 15 WHEREAS, the Governing Body adopted Ordinance #2017-3 on March 8, 2017 that 16 created a new process for approving the sale and consumption of alcohol on city property; and 17 Whereas, the MRC is part of the larger parks that includes Marty Sanchez which sells 18 alcohol at many events. 19 WHEREAS, for locations not specifically mentioned in Section 23-6.2(A) SFCC 1987, 20 the approval by the Governing Body of a resolution that specifies the event, date hours, location, 21 number of expected attendees, type of alcohol to be served, and required permits is required 60 22 days prior to the event; and 23 WHEREAS, the Santa Fe Adult Soccer League held a Party on the Pitch soccer 24 tournament in 2016 at the Downs and in 2017 at the Bernalillo Soccer Complex; and 25 WHEREAS, the League desires to hold this year's tournament at the City's Municipal

1	Recreation Complex (MRC) where the fields have recently been redone, making them suitable to						
2	hold such a tournament; and						
3	WHEREAS, the soccer fields are part of the larger Municipal Recreation Complex						
4	which includes Marty Sanchez Golf Course at which alcohol is regularly served; and						
5	WHEREAS, at each of the last two Party on the Pitch Tournaments, the Santa Fe Adult						
6	Soccer League has partnered with Santa Fe Brewing Company to provide a beer garden for						
7	players and fans to enjoy during and after games held over the two days; and						
8	WHEREAS, alcohol service provided by Santa Fe Brewing Company for this event						
9	would adhere to all regulations required in Section 23-6.3 SFCC 1987; and						
10	WHEREAS, the Party on the Pitch Tournament hopes to attract increasing numbers of						
11	out-of-city and out-of-state teams to participate to show the demand for high quality soccer fields						
12	in the area and spur the eventual development of the Santa Fe Soccer Complex.

14	CITY OF SANTA FE that alcohol service during the Party on the Pitch soccer tournament is

In past years the tournament has been held at the Santa Fe Downs and at the soccer complex in Bernalillo. The tournament has drawn hundreds of players and spectators from around the state and from neighboring states. Alcohol sales at past tournaments has not resulted in any issues and has been strictly regulated. The tournament organizers hope to grow the event to show that an upgraded soccer complex in the City would attract teams from across the state and the greater Southwest region. Sales of beer would have to comply with all regulations set out in 23-6.3 SFCC 1987.
