The City will waive all fees associated with this event including permit fees, and any costs associated with Police and Fire protection. Police costs are estimated at \$1,822. Fire will use on duty staff, so there will be no additional costs associated with the event. Remaining balance is for the permit fees, personnel, and other operating costs (permit fee=\$685, 4 parks employees - 8 hours@\$30=\$960, 1 special event coordinator - 8 hours@\$50=\$400, equipment - trash bags, etc=\$300, 1 electrician=\$300)..
