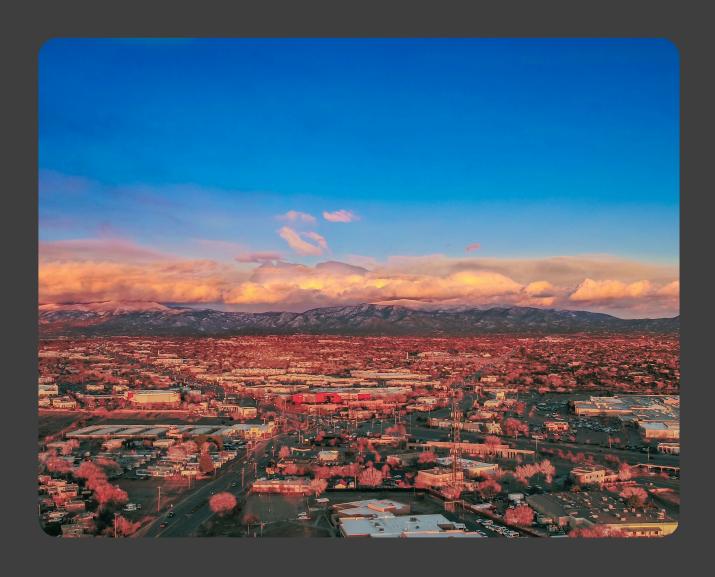


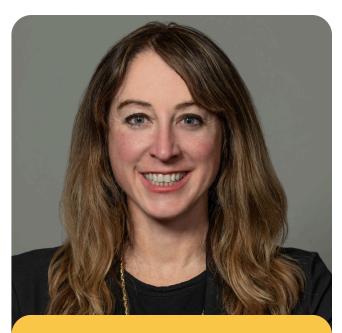

PRIORITY #1 BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

We focused on supporting businesses by connecting them to the resources and community networks essential for growth and success. Our efforts emphasized collaboration and increasing both access to and awareness of available opportunities.

To advance this work, we developed and implemented several key events and programs, including:



***** OED OFFICE HOURS

This initiative launched in March 2024 to provide businesses with one-on-one access to personalized guidance and resources. OED Office Hours are held twice monthly—at the Santa Fe Business Incubator and Del Norte Credit Union on Cerrillos Road. These sessions connect local businesses and entrepreneurs with the tools and support they need to grow and succeed.

PRIORITY #4 STRATEGIC ASSET DEVELOPMENT

This team focuses on identifying and leveraging key resources, from real estate and infrastructure projects to community partnerships, that drive long-term economic growth and sustainability.



* HIGHLIGHTS

- Spacebase Launch: New lease management system tracking 100+ City of Santa Fe leases, including at the Santa Fe Regional Airport.
- Midtown Development: Redevelopment into a mixed-use district, including production studios, arts center, and community spaces.
- Richards Avenue Land: 23-acre purchase for future affordable housing and urban space development.
- Active Projects: RFPs for Las Estrellas and 1614 Paseo de Peralta deployed, development projects on 599 and 285 Las Estrellas, new local business tenant at the Railyard Depot.

PRIORITY #5 BROADBAND DEVELOPMENT AND WI-FI ACCESSIBILITY

Reliable internet is essential to Santa Fe's growth, equity, and connectedness. In partnership with the New Mexico Office of Broadband Access and Expansion, we are working to expand and improve access across our community.

* ONGOING EFFORTS

- Wi-Fi Utility Poles: Installed three Wi-Fi utility poles at Trailer Ranch RV Park, providing internet access to residents.
- Broadband Strategic Action Plan: Currently in development, this plan aims to enhance connectivity across Santa Fe, ensuring equitable access to reliable internet for all residents and businesses. The plan is designed with a focus on long-term infrastructure growth and community needs.

PRIORITY #6 ECONOMIC MOBILITY

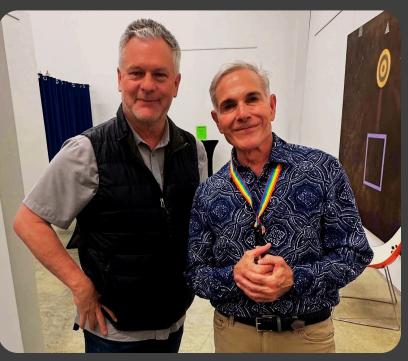
Economic mobility means creating real pathways for individuals to grow, adapt, and pursue opportunities—including entrepreneurship. By removing barriers for both workers and employers, we are building a more inclusive and resilient economy for all.

* ONGOING EFFORTS

- Hosted a Social Resource Fair in partnership with Chainbreaker Collective to connect residents with vital services.
- Developed outreach materials to promote local and state internship opportunities for youth and job seekers.
- Collaborated with the AmeriCorps VISTA program to strengthen capacity for economic opportunity initiatives.
- Partnered with Artwalk Santa Fe to host a Social Resources Pop-Up, blending culture with community support.
- Sponsored two Family-Friendly New Mexico workshops to help local businesses become certified family-friendly employers.
- Selected as a Planning Grantee in the national Cities for Financial Empowerment Fund's FEC Academy—an important step toward launching a Financial Empowerment Center in Santa Fe.

PRIORITY #7 STRATEGIC PLANNING AND ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

We began Phase 1 of our strategic planning process, focused on data collection. This phase will inform an update to the City's Economic Development Plan—replacing the 2004 version. We look forward to working closely with our community to gather input, with progress updates expected in 2025. Phase 2 will launch in 2025 and focus on strategy development and implementation.







5 FORWARD-LOOKING STRATEGIES FOR SUSTAINABLE GROWTH

1 The Power of Collaboration

Our path forward depends on strong, purposeful partnerships with local businesses, organizations, and government bodies. By staying connected with those who know this city best, we will ensure that our actions align with real needs and that we can pool our resources to make a valuable impact.

Building a thriving Santa Fe means addressing the obstacles that prevent people from getting ahead. This includes access to education, childcare, and financial resources. By addressing these challenges head-on, we can create opportunities that allow more residents to succeed and actively participate in the city's growth.
