11	PROCLAIMING SEVERE OR EXTREME DROUGHT CONDITIONS EXIST IN THE					
12	CITY OF SANTA FE; IMPOSING FIRE RESTRICTIONS AUGUST 10, 2022, TO					
13	SEPTEMBER 10, 2022; BANNING THE SALE OR USE OF FIREWORKS WITHIN THE					
14	CITY OF SANTA FE; ENCOURAGING RESIDENTS TO PREPARE A PERSONAL					
15	WILDFIRE ACTION PLAN; AND ENCOURAGING RESIDENTS TO FOLLOW THE					
16	FIRE DEPARTMENT'S FIRE READINESS GUIDELINES.					
17						
18	WHEREAS, the danger of range fires, grass fires, forest fires and structure fires remains					
19	high in and around the city of Santa Fe; and					
20	WHEREAS, despite recent rains, the probability of ignition of materials likely to serve as					
21	fuel for fire is presently extremely high in the city of Santa Fe; and					
22	WHEREAS, if the city experiences a fire that burns out of control in the watershed, 40%					
23	of the city's water resources are at serious risk of complete loss or substantially reduced capacity;					
24	and					
25	WHEREAS, if the city experiences a fire that burns out of control in populated areas, it

1	may be necessary to evacuate and relocate affected residents; and				
2	WHEREAS, pursuant to NMSA 1978, Section 60-2C-8.1, the governing body of a				
3	municipality may restrict the sale or use of certain fireworks within the boundaries of the				
4	municipality on a short-term basis if severe or extreme drought conditions exist; and				
5	WHEREAS, Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham issued Executive Order No. 2022-22 on				
6	April 25, 2022 that urged municipalities to "consider implementing appropriate firework bansas				
7	well as any other appropriate fire prevention measures that they may legally enact."; and				
8	WHEREAS, while recent rains have provided much-needed moisture to the area,				
9	according to the most recently available update to the U.S. Drought Monitor, most of Santa Fe				
10	County is in an extreme drought, the second highest category.				
11	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF				
12	THE CITY OF SANTA FE:				
13	Section 1. This resolution shall be deemed a proclamation within the meaning of				
14	NMSA 1978, Section 60-2C-8.1 and SFCC 1987, Section 12-3.9.				
15	<b>Section 2.</b> As per NMSA 1978, Section 60-2C-8.1, the Governing Body anticipates				
16	severe or extreme drought conditions exist or may exist within the boundaries of the city of Santa				
17	Fe based upon current drought indices published by the national weather service and other relevant				
18	information supplied by the United States forest service.				
19	Section 3. The Governing Body bans the sale or use of all fireworks listed in this				
20	section from August 10 to September 10, 2022, to the maximum extent possible permitted in				
21	NMSA 1978, Section 60-2C-8.1.				
22	A. The sale or use of the following fireworks is specifically banned within				
23	the city limits:				
24	1. ariel shell kit-reloadable tubes;				
25	2. aerial spinners;

2		4.	mines;
3		5.	missile-type rockets;
4		6.	multiple tube devices;
5		7.	roman candles;
6		8.	shells;

16	Section 4.	Pursua	nt to SFCC 1987, Section 12-3.9,
17	A.	Any in	dividual, firm, partnership, or other entity found in violation of the
18	above restriction	ons shal	l be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by
19	imprisonment f	or up to	ninety (90) days or a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500),
20	or both.		
21	B.	Each a	and every occasion on which this section is violated shall be
22	considered a se	parate o	ffense.
23	BE IT FURT	HER R	<b>ESOLVED</b> that the Governing Body strongly encourages City
24	residents to prepare a	Ready-	Set-Go Personal Wildfire Action Plan; to take precautions and
25	measures so as to redu	ce or eli	minate conditions around their residences and places of work that

could serve as fuel for a fire, including removing and properly disposing of unused household chemicals, oil, and gas; and to make use of alternative recreation options such as the City's inner-City trails, open spaces, parks, and recreation centers.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Governing Body strongly encourages residents of Santa Fe to follow the Fire Department's Fire Readiness guidelines, especially in the wildland-urban interface areas. The guidelines are the following:

- 1. Reduce flammable materials within five (5) feet surrounding the primary residents (e.g., removing firewood, flammable vegetation, cardboard boxes, construction lumber, etc.); and
- 2. Increase defensible space within thirty (30) feet surrounding the primary residence in accordance with Fire Department recommendations; and
- 3. Remove flammable leaf litter and needle cast from roofs and gutters from all buildings on the property; and
- 4. Consider acquiring recommendations from the Fire Department through a wildfire hazard assessment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governing Body recognizes that NMSA 1978, Section 60-2C-8.1 only allows municipalities to adopt fire restrictions through this temporary mechanism for thirty (30) days at a time and no less than twenty (20) days prior to a holiday for which fireworks may be sold. Therefore, to ensure that there will be no lapse in the fire restrictions imposed by this resolution, the Governing Body may impose these fire restrictions at any subsequent meeting date hereafter to ensure that such fire restrictions are in place during extreme or severe drought conditions and wildland fire conditions.
