11	SUPPORTING THE NEIGHBOR TO NEIGHBOR FUND DRIVE 2022.

13	WHEREAS, according to Feeding America, New Mexico has one of the lowest rankings
14	among states for food security; and
15	WHEREAS, the same study found that, in New Mexico, over 323,000 people seek food
16	assistance annually; and
17	WHEREAS, additionally, over 19,200 people live in poverty in Santa Fe County including
18	over 5,000 children; and
19	WHEREAS, the study also found that in Santa Fe County, one in three children were
20	affected by hunger during the pandemic; and
21	WHEREAS, research has demonstrated children who go without adequate healthy food
22	cannot thrive nor learn well; and
23	WHEREAS, public and private partnerships can both feed children and improve the local
24	agricultural economy; and
25	WHEREAS, it is the mission of The Food Depot to end hunger in Northern New Mexico;

WHEREAS, The Food Depot fulfills this goal through serving as the food bank for nine Northern New Mexico counties, providing food to more than 145 nonprofit agencies, including emergency food pantries, hot meal programs, homeless shelters, youth programs, senior centers, homes for the mentally disabled, and shelters for battered persons; and

WHEREAS, in 2021, The Food Depot distributed an average of 885,153 pounds of food each month, providing more than 737,627 meals to people in need, including the most vulnerable in our community; and

WHEREAS, more than just feeding people, The Food Depot is trying to help people change their lives; and

WHEREAS, every September since 2012, the neighborhoods in the Santa Fe area have participated in donating food to The Food Depot through an area-wide neighborhood and business "Neighbor to Neighbor" Food/Fund Drive, in conjunction with the national "Hunger Action Month"; and

WHEREAS, the drive has grown exponentially over the last ten years; and

WHEREAS, the onset of the novel coronavirus pandemic restricted the ability of the Neighbor to Neighbor to conduct the annual food drive in the traditional manner; and

WHEREAS, instead, the Drive accepted monetary donations so that The Food Depot could purchase food that will be distributed to needy families in northern New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, in 2020 the Santa Fe community raised \$170,979, equal to 854,895 pounds of food, or 712,412 meals for those in need, illustrating the importance of the Neighbor-to-Neighbor Fund Drive in accomplishing the mission of The Food Depot; and

WHEREAS, in 2021 the Santa Fe community raised \$201,428.99, equal to over 1 million pound of food, or 805,716 meals for those in need, illustrating the importance of the Neighbor to Neighbor Fund Drive in accomplishing the mission of The Food Depot; and
