11	SUPPORTING THE SANTA FE PUBLIC SCHOOLS' BOARD OF EDUCATION'S
12	APPLICATION FOR GRANT FUNDING TO BUILD OUT A DISTRICT-WIDE
13	COMMUNITY SCHOOLS MODEL DESIGNED TO REDUCE CHRONIC
14	ABSENTEEISM, DECREASE OUT-OF-SCHOOL TIME CAUSED BY SUSPENSIONS,
15	INCREASE PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT, AND IMPROVE KINDERGARTEN
16	READINESS SKILLS.

18	WHEREAS, Santa Fe is a city with students that hail from all ranges of wealth; and
19	WHEREAS, many students that come from the lower end of the income spectrum struggle
20	in school, where many of life's most important lessons are learned; and
21	WHEREAS, Santa Fe Public Schools' Board of Education ("BoE") has applied for a grant
22	to establish a district-wide community schools model designed to provide a holistic and familial
23	approach to learning; and
24	WHEREAS, the grant amount can range between \$250k-\$500k per year for five years, an
25	amount determined by the grant reviewers; and

WHEREAS, a community school is a research-based, equity driven strategy that brings students, families, organizations, and communities together to transform education and create wellrounded educational opportunities and support systems; and

WHEREAS, community schools vary based on the context of needs, assets, and priorities of the body of students attending the school; and

6 WHEREAS, according to the New Mexico Community Schools Logic Model, which
7 outlines a long-term strategy for improving the learning environment for its students, the "theory
8 of action" states that "if school and community partners meet the needs of the whole child, then
9 transformational changes will occur that result in healthy, secure students ready for college, career
10 and life"; and

WHEREAS, there are four pillars of community schools: expanded and enriched learning
time and opportunities, collaborative leadership and practices, active family and community
engagement, and integrated student supports; and

WHEREAS, expanded and enriched learning time and opportunities includes enrichment
activities that emphasize real-world learning and community problem solving as well as after
school, weekend, and summer programs that provide academic instruction and individualized
support; and

WHEREAS, collaborative leadership and practices enable parents, students, teachers,
 principals, and community partners to build a culture of professional learning, collective trust, and
 shared responsibility using strategies such as site-based leadership teams and teacher learning
 communities; and

WHEREAS, active family and community engagement allows schools to function as neighborhood hubs where there are educational opportunities for adults and family members to share their stories and serve as equal partners in promoting student success; and

WHEREAS, integrated students support provides a dedicated staff member to coordinate
