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5	AN ORDINANCE
6	AMENDING SECTION 12-1 OF THE UNIFORM TRAFFIC ORDINANCE TO ADD A
7	DEFINITION FOR "FACTORY-INSTALLED EXHAUST OPTION; AND AMENDING
8	SCHEDULE A OF THE UNIFORM TRAFFIC ORDINANCE TO INCREASE PENALTIES
9	FOR MUFFLER NOISE VIOLATIONS AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
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11	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE:
12	Section 1. Section 12-1-23.1 of the Uniform Traffic Ordinance (being Ord. No.
13	2011-4, as amended) is amended to read:
14	12-1-23.1 FACTORY-INSTALLED EXHAUST OPTION. "Factory-Installed
15	Exhaust Option" means an exhaust system for a motor vehicle that is offered as an option by the
16	manufacturer and/or dealer to the purchaser that allows the driver of the motor vehicle to adjust the
17	sound levels of the motor vehicle's exhaust. Examples of Factory-Installed Exhaust Option include,
18	but are not limited to, Ford's Active Valve Performance Exhaust and Porsche's Porsche Sports
19	Exhaust.
20	A. Every motor vehicle shall at all times be equipped with a muffler in good working
21	order and in constant operation to prevent excessive or unusual noise, and no person shall use a
22	muffler cutout, muffler bypass, straight-through mufflers that do not contain baffles (including but
23	not limited to glass packs, steel packs, and straight pipes), or similar device upon a motor vehicle
24	on a street in this municipality.
25	B. The muffler, emission control equipment or device, engine and power mechanism

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of every motor vehicle shall be so equipped and adjusted as to prevent the escape of excessive fumes or smoke.

- C. Every registered gasoline-fueled motor vehicle manufactured or assembled, commencing with the 1968 models, shall at all times be equipped and maintained in good working order with the factory-installed devices and equipment or their replacements designed to prevent, reduce, or control exhaust emissions or air pollution. Such devices or equipment shall not be modified in a manner which will amplify or increase the noise emitted by the motor of such vehicle above that emitted by a muffler of the type originally installed on the vehicle.
- D. The use of a factory-installed exhaust option is prohibited and violates this ordinance if the noise emitted exceeds the decibel level reading described in Section 10.2-9.
- E. Muffler changes or modification. No person shall sell, offer for sale, install or offer to install, modify or change the exhaust muffler, intake muffler, or any other noise abatement device of a motor vehicle in a way that increases or tends to increase the exhaust fumes, smoke, or noise from a motor vehicle. Such prohibited changes or modifications shall include, but not be limited to cut-outs, by-passes, and straight-through mufflers that do not contain baffles (including but not limited to glass packs, steel packs, and straight pipes).
- F. For a first offense under paragraphs A, B, or C above, a person shall not be convicted if repairs are affected on the motor vehicle and the vehicle passes a compliance test within ninety (90) days of the citation being issued.
- G. The city manager or the city manager's designee shall prescribe the compliance test based on the decibel levels identified as excessive in Section 10.2-9. A person cited under this section may rely on measured decibel levels from the compliance test as an affirmative defense in challenging a citation.

9	SECTION 2.
10	A. "Penalty assessment misdemeanor" means violation of the following listed
11	sections of the city of Santa Fe Uniform Traffic Code for which the listed penalty assessment is
12	established. The term "penalty assessment misdemeanor" does not include any violation which has
13	caused or contributed to the cause of an accident resulting in injury or death to any person. When
14	an alleged violator of a penalty assessment misdemeanor elects to accept a notice to appear in lieu
15	of a notice of penalty assessment, the fine imposed upon later conviction shall not exceed the
16	penalty assessment established for the particular penalty assessment misdemeanor and probation
17	imposed upon a suspended or deferred sentence shall not exceed ninety days. (Ord. No. 2021-2, §
