13	Section 1.	Section 23-4.13 of SFCC 1987 (being Ord. No. Ord. No. 2015-33) is amended

11			and runs sport or recreation programs for youth up to the age of eighteen
12			(18).
13			(a) Each youth league shall be assessed a one hundred dollar
14			(\$100.00) permit fee per season, per sport or recreation activity.
15			(b) Each youth league shall provide adult representatives from its
16			respective league to participate in the Great American Spring
17			Cleanup and the Toss No Mas Fall Cleanup events hosted by Keep
18			Santa Fe Beautiful. Each league shall encourage youth
19			participants to attend the Keep Santa Fe Beautiful events.
20		(2)	Adult league means a non-profit entity that organizes and runs sport or
21			recreation programs for adults over the age of eighteen (18), for a season.
22			Each adult league shall be assessed the following fees, per season, and
23			such fees are inclusive of one (1) end-of-season tournament:
24			(a) Twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) fee per player, necessary to field a
25			team according to each individual league; and

1			(b)	Twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) fee for one (1) alternate player per

10		post to the city's website, a field use management plan.			
11	(2)	When other city sports fields are unavailable to accommodate you			
12		leagues or youth tournaments, on a particular day, weekend or week, a			
13		the MRC fields are not scheduled for use for that particular day, weeken			
14		or week, then the MRC fields may be made available to provide a field f			
15		such event at a pro-rated MRC fee.			
16	F. Nonc	ompliance. A league that does not comply with the requirements of Section			
17	23-7 SFCC 1987 shall not be granted a permit to use sports fields at the MRC or the league permit				
18	may be suspended.
