11	SUPPORTING THE NEIGHBOR-TO-NEIGHBOR FUND DRIVE 2023.

13	WHEREAS, according to Feeding America, the largest hunger-relief organization in the
14	United States, New Mexico has one of the lowest rankings for food security in the United States
15	and
16	WHEREAS, Feeding America's regularly conducted study entitled "Map the Meal Gap,"
17	found that as of 2021, in the state of New Mexico, over 285,220 people seek food assistance
18	annually, and 90,490 of them are children; and
19	WHEREAS, additionally, according to Feeding America's 2021 data from Map the Mea
20	Gap, over 15,420 people experience food insecurity in Santa Fe County; and
21	WHEREAS, The Food Depot describes its vision is "Healthy, hunger-free communities
22	in Northern New Mexico; and
23	WHEREAS, The Food Depot fulfills this goal by serving as the food bank for nine
24	Northern New Mexico counties and providing food to more than 145 nonprofit agencies, including
25	emergency food pantries, hot meal programs, homeless shelters, youth programs, senior centers

1 homes for the mentally disabled, and shelters for battered persons; and 2 WHEREAS, in 2022, The Food Depot and its partner agencies distributed 10 million 3 pounds of food across northern New Mexico, providing 700,000 meals each month; and 4 WHEREAS, more than just feeding people, The Food Depot describes itself as trying to 5 help people change their lives; and 6 WHEREAS, every September since 2012, the neighborhoods in the Santa Fe area have 7 participated in donating food to The Food Depot through an area-wide neighborhood and business 8 Neighbor to Neighbor Fund Drive, in conjunction with national Hunger Action Month; and 9 WHEREAS, the Neighbor to Neighbor Fund Drive has grown exponentially over the last 10 twelve years; and 11 WHEREAS, The Food Depot raised nearly \$294,000 in its Neighbor to Neighbor Fund 12 Drive 2022; and 13 WHEREAS, in 2021 the Santa Fe community raised \$201,428.99, equal to over 1 million 14 pounds of food, or 805,716 meals for those in need; and 15 WHEREAS, in 2020 the Santa Fe community raised \$170,979, equal to 854,895 pounds 16 of food, or 712,412 meals for those in need; and 17 WHEREAS, the success of the fund drives in 2020 through 2022 illustrates the importance 18 of the Neighbor -to Neighbor Fund Drive in accomplishing the mission of The Food Depot; and 19 WHEREAS, the Neighbor to Neighbor Fund Drive 2023 has the goal of raising \$300,000 20 and will benefit The Food Depot with the donations raised by Santa Fe area neighborhoods, 21 businesses, and communities, and it will culminate on Saturday, September 23, 2023; and 22 WHEREAS, the success of the Neighbor to Neighbor Fund Drive over the preceding 23 twelve years is evidence that it is well-situated to be an annual event in which neighborhoods and 24 businesses across the City look forward to participating each year, with the encouragement and 25 support of the City and its elected officials.
