9	A RESOLUTION		
10	RELATING TO FIREARMS; RECOGNIZING THAT CERTAIN CITY PROPERTIES		
11	ARE USED FOR SCHOOL-RELATED ACTIVITIES, WHICH MAKES THE CARRYING		
12	OF A DEADLY WEAPON ON SUCH PROPERTIES A FOURTH-DEGREE FELONY		
13	PURSUANT TO NMSA 1978, SECTION 30-7-2.1; AND DIRECTING THE CITY		
14	MANAGER TO WORK WITH STAFF TO POST NOTICE ON SUCH FACILITIES.		
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16	WHEREAS, NMSA 1978, Section 30-7-2.1 provides that unlawful carrying of a deadly		
17	weapon on school premises consists of carrying a deadly weapon on school premises except by a		
18	peace officer, school security personnel, authorized personnel in a military training corps program		
19	or state-authorized hunter safety training instruction, a person in a school-approved program that		
20	actively involves the carrying of a deadly weapon, or a person older than 19 in a private automobile		
21	for lawful protection of person or property; and		
22	WHEREAS, included in the definition of school premises is "anypublic buildings or		
23	grounds, including playing fields and parking areas that are not public-school property, in or on		
24	which public school-related and sanctioned activities are being performed"; and		
25	WHEREAS, whoever commits unlawful carrying of a deadly weapon on school premises		
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is guilty of a fourth-degree felony; and

2 WHEREAS, a number of City-owned spaces, buildings, and other property are both 3 governmental and used for school-related and sanctioned activities and therefore are "sensitive 4 places" as identified by the U.S. Supreme Court; and 5 WHEREAS, according to the Naval Postgraduate Schools Center for Homeland Defense 6 and Security, between 1970 and June, 2022, there have been 2069 school shootings; and 7 WHEREAS, those 2069 shootings have resulted in 684 fatalities and 1937 injuries: and 8 WHEREAS, of the 2069 school shootings, 985 have occurred since the tragic incident at 9 Sandy Hook Elementary School nearly ten years ago in December, 2012; and 10 WHEREAS, according to the K-12 School Shooting Database, New Mexico has 11 experienced 22 school shootings between 1971 and June, 2022, resulting in six deaths and 10 12 injuries; and 13 WHEREAS, in 2017, a 16-year-old student entered the Clovis-Carver Library in Clovis, 14 NM and killed two people and wounded four others; and 15 WHEREAS, according to the Washington Post's school shootings database, more than 16 311,000 students at 331 schools have experienced gun violence at school since the Columbine High 17 School shooting on April 20, 1999; and 18 WHEREAS, children who witness a shooting can be severely traumatized by the incident 19 - trauma that can last a lifetime; and 20 WHEREAS, witnessing a shooting may impact the student's ability to continue studies, 21 may impact a student's social and emotional growth, and may cause a student to become anxious 22 or depressed; a student may even develop chronic psychiatric disorders as the result of witnessing 23 a shooting; and 24 WHEREAS, since the shooting at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, Texas, in which 19 second through fourth grade students and two teachers were killed, there have been 50 school 25

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shootings with four deaths and 32 injured.

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2	NOW	, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE	
3	CITY OF SANTA FE that the Governing Body recognizes that the following City locations are		
4	used for school-related or sanctioned events and therefore the carrying of deadly weapons on those		
5	properties is a fourth-degree felony under NMSA 1978, Section 30-7-2.1:		
6	1.	Santa Fe Community Convention Center and underground garage;	
7	2.	Municipal Recreation Complex soccer fields;	
8	3.	Genoveva Chavez Community Center;	
9	4.	Main library;	
10	5.	LaFarge library;	
11	6.	Southside library;	
12	7.	Facilities at which the Mayor's Youth Advisory Board holds their regular	
13		meetings;	
14	8.	Facilities to which students visit as part of a school-related or school-sanctioned	
15		activities including, but not limited to, the Buckman Direct Diversion; and	
16	9.	Facilities in which school interns are working, as placed through the Santa Fe	
17		Public Schools, including, but not limited to, City Hall and Municipal Court.	
18	BE I	Γ FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager shall direct staff to post signage	
19	at the location	s listed above that states that deadly weapons are prohibited pursuant to NMSA 1978,	
20	Section 30-7-2	2.1.	
21	BE I	Γ FURTHER RESOLVED that, when the City Manager identifies additional City	
22	locations that are used for school-related or sanctioned events, the City Manager may direct staff		
23	to post signage at those locations and events to state that deadly weapons are prohibited pursuant		
24	to NMSA 1978, Section 30-7-2.1.		
25	BE I	T FURTHER RESOLVED the City Manager shall consult with the Community	

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1	Health and Safety Department, including the Police Department, regarding the best method for			
2	enforcing NMSA 1978, Section 30-7-2.1 in relation to applicable City properties.
