The purpose of this purchase is to modernize the Parks Division's 30-year-old controller that irrigates parks citywide because its functionality is compromised. Its software is outdated and no carries tech-support services. The centralized computer that had been able to remotely adjust schedules, turn systems on and off, and monitor for leaks is now causing inefficiencies in the field. This contract also allows us to update our Motorola controllers in parks where the on-site units are dysfunctional, and it also provides a much-needed radio-communications upgrade.

Mesa Turf Products, LLC is the only authorized sole-source distributor in New Mexico for Motorola and Interspec products. Please see the attached sole-source letter provided by Interspec. Since the City has invested in Motorola products, there is a cost savings achieved by staying with the proprietary product and upgrading our technologies without additional start-up costs associated with brand-new systems.

3. Explain why other similar professional services, services, construction or item(s) of tangible personal property *cannot* meet the intended purpose of the contract.

Thirty years ago, the city invested in Motorola technology for irrigation to water their parks. This system is proprietary. The current computer software that operates the hardware of our system (the time controllers, valves, meters, etc...) is very outdated and is no longer supported by Motorola/Interspec. This purchase would update and modernize our irrigation system software and replace aging and failing hardware. Additionally, the radio system that communicates between the central system and the controllers also is no longer supported and needs to be changed to a UHF 400 MHz range. This radio conversion is critical as the system will stop working this year without this needed change and cost the City additional man-hours in the field turning valves on/off, checking for leaks, etc... The parks system is very spread out and having remote controls are essential feature to labor savings. It is worth noting, too, that if we don't do this, we could see widespread turf, plant, and tree loss.

Item and Action

Request approval of a purchase agreement with Mesa Turf Products in the total amount of \$91,934.38 for upgrades to the City Parks central irrigation system.

Background and Summary

Upgrades to the City Parks central irrigation system are urgently required prior to the upcoming irrigation season to prevent loss of turf and landscaping in City of Santa Fe parks. The Motorola/Interspec centralized irrigation system is 30 years old and will soon be obsolete. The cost of the system was originally approximately \$450,000. The system can be upgraded at a lower cost than full system replacement. The system consists of a computer, main controller, onsite controllers, and remote communications.

Planned upgrades include:

- Software: The current software is obsolete and unsupported and will be upgraded. The software allows Parks to manage irrigation water efficiently and effectively by setting run-times, operating valves remotely and monitoring leaks.
- Radio system: This unit communicates between the on-site and main controllers. The
 radio must be changed to a UHF 400 MHz range because the old system will no longer
 be supported.
- Irrigation controllers: Over time, the City will need to replace all 35 of the on-site irrigation controllers. Five of the oldest units will be replaced with this contract. Additional controllers will be replaced over the course of six or eight years.

Mesa Turf Products is a sole distributor for the Interspec/Motorola Corporation for our region.

Funding for this project was allocated by the Governing Body in the FY21 Capital Reallocation.
